PRESIDENT'S REPORT

WELCOME TO THE 2021 ANNUAL REPORT OF THE WESTERN REGION FOOTBALL LEAGUE.

AFTER NOT BEING ABLE TO STAGE ANY COMPETITIONS IN 2020, WE ALL EMBRACED THE RETURN OF FOOTBALL AND NETBALL WITH ENTHUSIASM. IT IS A TESTIMONY TO THE HARD WORK OF ALL CLUBS AND THE COMMITMENT OF ALL VOLUNTEERS THAT WE SWUNG BACK INTO ACTION SMOOTHLY. I ALSO WANT TO RECOGNISE THE GREAT WORK OF MATT AND HIS TEAM AT WRFL HQ WHO WORKED TIRELESSLY TO ENSURE THE COMPETITIONS WENT AHEAD DESPITE THE ONGOING CHALLENGES DUE TO COVID RESTRICTIONS.

IT WAS UNFORTUNATE THAT OUR SEASON CAME TO AN ABRUPT END. NOT BEING ABLE TO PLAY FINALS WAS DISAPPOINTING FOR US ALL. WHILE IT IS NOT THE SAME AS RUNNING OUT ON THE GROUND TO PLAY IN A FINAL OR HOLDING THE PREMIERSHIP CUP AFTER A HARD FOUGHT GRAND FINAL WIN, IT WAS GREAT TO RECOGNISE THE ON-FIELD PERFORMANCES AND THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF THOSE WHO SUPPORT THE GAME - COACHES, TRAINERS, AND CLUB VOLUNTEERS.CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL WHO WERE RECOGNISED IN THE PRESENTATION EVENTS.

AS WE MOVE INTO 2022, WE LOOK FORWARD OPTIMISTICALLY TO OUR FIRST COMPLETE SEASON IN THREE YEARS. NEXT YEAR WILL ALSO BE THE FINAL YEAR OF THE LEAGUE'S STRATEGIC PLAN-WHICH WE DEVELOPED IN 2018. CEO'S REPORT

IT HAS CLEARLY BEEN A
CHALLENGING TWO YEARS FOR
EVERYONE, INCLUDING MANY OF YOU
READING THIS REPORT. WHILE 2021
OFFERED BURSTS OF 'NORMALITY', AS
WE KNOW THESE ALL-TOO-QUICKLY
MADE WAY FOR FURTHER
LOCKDOWNS, INCLUDING THE ONE
THAT ULTIMATELY BROUGHT ABOUT A
PREMATURE END TO OUR 2021
SEASON.

IT IS EASY TO LOOK BACK ON THE LAST TWO YEARS AND FOCUS ON WHAT WAS NOT, RATHER THAN WHAT WAS. BUT 2021 STILL SAW A NUMBER OF REMARKABLE ACHIEVEMENTS, NOT LEAST OF WHICH THE RETURN OF OUR COMMUNITY GAME WHILE A GLOBAL PANDEMIC CONTINUED, WITH THE LEAGUE GOING ON TO COMPLETE TWO THIRDS OF ITS SEASON.

PERHAPS MORE REMARKABLY, AND DESPITE THE SUGGESTION THAT PEOPLE WOULD EFFECTIVELY 'OPTOUT' OF COMMUNITY SPORT AFTER 12 MONTHS ON THE SIDELINES, OUR PARTICIPATION NUMBERS REMAINED COMPARABLE TO 2019, REINFORCING THE INTEGRAL ROLE THE WRFL PLAYS IN THE FABRIC OF THE WESTERN SUBURBS' COMMUNITY.

AND WHILE THE WORDS 'INNOVATION'
AND 'PIVOT' HAVE BEEN USED AD
NAUSEAM, WE TRULY HAVE
EXPERIENCED INNOVATION,
INCLUDING A NECESSARY FOCUS ON
ALL THINGS DIGITAL, THAT HAS
INEVITABLY CHANGED AND INDEED
IMPROVED OUR BUSINESS
FOREVERMORE.

ONE SUCH EXAMPLE OF A REQUIRED PIVOT THAT WILL HAVE A LASTING IMPACT COULD BE SEEN WITH OUR JUNIOR AND SENIOR PRESENTATION EVENINGS. NORMALLY LIMITED TO THE GUESTS IN ATTENDANCE IN THE ROOM AND STAGED ON A SINGLE EVENING, THIS YEAR 'THE ROOM' INCLUDED LOUNGE ROOMS, BEDROOMS, BATHROOMS – ANYWHERE SOMEONE HAD AN INTERNET CONNECTION. THE PRESENTATION EVENINGS WERE BROADCAST TO TENS OF THOUSANDS ONLINE AND STAGED OVER A FOURWEEK PERIOD.

AS WE EMBARK ON SEASON 2022, WE DO SO WITH GENUINE OPTIMISM OF ACHIEVING OUR FIRST UNINTERRUPTED RUN SINCE 2019.



THERE WILL INEVITABLY REMAIN SIGNIFICANT CHALLENGES, SOME OF WHICH A RESULT OF THE LAST TWO YEARS. SOME VOLUNTEERS HAVE BEEN LOST TO THE GAME, AND THERE HAS BEEN INCREASED COMPETITION FOR BOTH PARTICIPANTS AND SPONSORSHIP DOLLARS ALIKE. HOWEVER, WITH INCREASED VACCINATION RATES WILL COME INCREASED COMMUNITY CONFIDENCE, AND WE TRUST THAT THOSE THAT MAY HAVE LESSENED THEIR INVOLVEMENT WITH THE GAME OVER THE LAST TWO YEARS WILL INDEED RETURN.

A NUMBER OF EXCITING
DEVELOPMENTS ARE SET FOR 2022,
INCLUDING THE POTENTIAL FOR THE
WRFL TO UNDERGO A REBRAND THAT
SEEKS TO RECOGNISE THE
EMERGENCE OF NETBALL AND ITS
INCREASING SIGNIFICANCE TO THE
LEAGUE'S DNA. WHILE A LOT OF
WATER STILL NEEDS TO GO UNDER
THE BRIDGE BEFORE THIS OCCURS, IT
IS SOMETHING WE ARE ACTIVELY
EXPLORING.

EVERY YEAR I ACKNOWLEDGE OUR SPONSORS FOR THEIR SUPPORT AND NOTE THAT WE COULD NOT DO WHAT WE DO WITHOUT THEM, BUT NEVER HAS THIS BEEN MORE TRUE THAN OVER THE PAST TWO YEARS. WHILE UNDERSTANDABLY NOT EVERY SPONSOR HAS MANAGED TO STAY ON BOARD, I HAVE BEEN SO ENERGISED BY THE NUMBER THAT HAVE.

AS WE REACH THE CONCLUSION OF 2021, I A SPECIAL MENTION AND THANK YOU TO HAVE ENJOYED REFLECTING ON WHAT WAS A UNIQUE YEAR AND LOOK AHEAD TO THE EXCITING OPPORTUNITIES THAT LIE AHEAD IN 2022.

LIKE MANY THINGS DURING COVID, THERE WAS A LOT OF UNCERTAINTY AROUND WHAT THE SEASON WOULD LOOK LIKE. IN 2021 WE SAW 197 JUNIOR TEAMS TAKE THE FIELD AND A RESTRUCTURE OF THE JUNIORS GIRLS COMPETITION MOVING TO DOUBLE AGES IN THE HOPES OF CREATING MORE COMPETITIVE DIVISIONS.

IT HAS BEEN AN INCREDIBLY CHALLENGING YEAR FOR ALL INVOLVED WITH JUNIOR FOOTBALL. WE GOT A TASTE OF COMPETITION ACROSS THE EARLY PART OF THE YEAR GETTING THROUGH 50% OF OUR SEASON BEFORE METROPOLITAN MELBOURNE WAS HIT WITH LOCKDOWNS THAT BROUGHT A STOP-START NATURE AND EVENTUALLY AN ABRUPT END TO THE SEASON.

WHILST WE COULDN'T HOST A FINALS SERIES THIS YEAR, WE CONGRATULATE ALL OUR MINOR PREMIERS AND BEST AND FAIREST WINNERS ON A FANTASTIC SEASON.

OFF THE BACK OF A DISAPPOINTING 2020 SEASON, THE EXCITEMENT AND ANTICIPATION THAT WAS BUILDING TO GET BACK ONTO OUR COURTS FOR THE 2021 VICTORIA UNIVERSITY WRFL NETBALL COMPETITION WAS GREAT TO SEE.

THERE WAS FANTASTIC ENTHUSIASM AND POSITIVITY THROUGHOUT THE EARLY STAGES OF THE YEAR, IN PREPARATION FOR THE WRFL'S FIRST EVER PRE-SEASON ROUND ROBIN COMPETITON. THIS INITIATIVE ACTED AS AN OPPORTUNITY FOR PLAYERS TO DUST OFF THE COBWEBS AND RETURN TO THE COURT. IT WAS ALSO A CHANCE FOR CLUBS TO HOST TRY OUTS AS WELL AS PROVIDE THE LEAGUE A CHANCE TO LOOK AT THE EARLY STAGES OF GRADING.

THE GROWING NUMBER OF CLUBS PARTICIPATING IN THE NETBALL COMPETITION IS CERTAINLY ONE TO CELEBRATE. THIS SEASON SAW RAPID GROWTH IN TEAM NUMBERS, WHICH LED TO HOSTING FOUR DIVISIONS. IN 2021 WE OFFICIALLY WELCOMED ALBANVALE, SUNSHINE HEIGHTS, WYNDHAMVALE AND LAVERTON INTO THE MIX, WITH THE TOTAL NUMBER OF TEAMS EXPANDING FROM 18 (IN 2019) TO 30, SHOWING A 66% INCREASE IN 2021.

OVER THE PAST COUPLE OF MONTHS, NEW CLUBS HAVE BEEN EXPRESSING AN INTEREST IN FORMING NETBALL TEAMS AS WELL AS CURRENT CLUBS IN THE COMPETITION STATING THEIR INTENT TO FURTHER ADD TO THEIR NUMBER OF TEAMS, WHICH HAS BEEN GREAT TO SEE. THE FUTURE OF WRFL NETBALL CERTAINLY LOOKS BRIGHT.

IT HAS BEEN A CHALLENGING YEAR FOR ALL INVOLVED WITH NETBALL THIS YEAR. WE PERSONALLY HAVE FOUND 2021 TO BE SIGNIFICANTLY HARDER THAN 2020 DUE TO GETTING A REAL TASTE OF THE COMPETITIONS, THE STOP START NATURE AND EVENTUALLY HAVING IT CANCELLED SO ABRUPTY.

AT WRFL HQ, WE WERE BUSY PLANNING HOW NETBALL COULD RESUME AND CLOSE OUT THE SEASON WITH PREMIERSHIPS. HOWEVER, AS THE ENVIRONMENT WAS EVER CHANGING, SO TOO WAS OUR LANDSCAPE AND IT BECOME INCREASINGLY APPARENT THAT NETBALL IN 2021 WASN'T GOING TO BE ABLE TO CONTINUE FURTHER.

WHILST WE WEREN'T ABLE TO HOST A FINALS SERIES, WE CONGRATULATE ALL OF OUR MINOR PREMIERS, LEADING GOAL SCORERS AND BEST AND FAIREST WINNERS ON A FANTASTIC SEASON.

THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE WRFL AND NETBALL VICTORIA ONLY STRENGTHENED IN 2021.

THIS YEAR WE WERE SET TO HAND OVER ACCESS TO THE DATABASE TO CLUBS THROUGH MY NETBALL, HOWEVER NETBALL VICTORIA HAVE SINCE INTRODUCED AN ENTIRELY NEW PLATFORM CALLED NETBALL CONNECT, WHICH IS SIGNIFCIANTLY MORE USER FRIENDLY FOR CLUBS AND WILL SIMPLIFY THE CURRENT PROCESSES CONCERNING GAMES TRACKING, GOAL SCORING TALLIES AND TEAM SHEETS.

THIS NEW PLATFORM GIVES CLUBS FULL CONTROL OVER THEIR REGISTRATIONS AND MEMBER PROCESSES. NETBALL VICTORIA IS SET TO COMMENCE TRAINING WITH OUR CLUBS IN FEBRUARY NEXT YEAR.

THIS YEAR ALSO SAW US REGISTER A TEAM IN THE NETBALL VICTORIA ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIPS, A VERY EXCITING INITIATIVE WHICH WOULD HAVE SEEN THE WRFL'S FIRST EVER REPRESENTATIVE NETBALL SIDE. UNFORTUNATELY, MUCH LIKE OTHER INITIATIVES IT WAS UNABLE TO GET OFF THE GROUND DUE TO LOCKDOWNS, BUT IS CERTAINLY SOMETHING WE WILL BE REVISITING IN 2022 AND ARE VERY EXCITED ABOUT.

WE THANK NETBALL VICTORIA FOR THEIR ONGOING SUPPORT AND GUIDANCE.

CLUB DEVELOPMENT REPORT

GARY BROWN



IT IS WITH GREAT DELIGHT THAT I PRESENT MY FIRST REPORT AS THE CLUB SUPPORT MANAGER OF THE WRFL HAVING COMMENCED MY ROLE ON THE EVE OF THE SEASON IN MID-MARCH.

FIRSTLY, I WOULD LIKE TO ACKNOWLEDGE THE DIFFICULTIES AND STRUGGLES MANY OF OUR CLUBS EXPERIENCED THIS YEAR IN GETTING TEAMS ON THE PARK, SOURCING VOLUNTEERS AND THEN THE SEASON BEING TORN APART AGAIN WITH THE ONGOING LOCKDOWNS.

ON THE BACK OF NO FOOTBALL AND AUSKICK IN 2020, JUNIOR TEAMS TOOK A BIG HIT THIS YEAR PARTICULARLY IN THE YOUNGER AGE GROUPS. THIS IS NOT A REFLECTION OF CLUBS, INDIVIDUALS, OR THE LEAGUE AS IT HAPPENED ACROSS MELBOURNE, WITH FOOTBALL NOT THE ONLY SPORT AFFECTED. ONWARDS AND UPWARDS NOW TOWARDS 2022!



IT WAS, HOWEVER, FANTASTIC CATCHING UP WITH CLUB PRESIDENTS, JUNIOR ADMINISTRATORS, AND HARD-WORKING VOLUNTEERS OVER THE COURSE OF THE SEASON ALL OF WHICH ASSISTED ME GREATLY IN GAINING A CLEAR UNDERSTANDING OF THE CLUBS, INCLUDING LEARNING, AND IDENTIFYING CHALLENGES THAT MAY BE PRESENT. I'M LOOKING FORWARD TO BUILDING ON THOSE RELATIONSHIPS AND WORKING ON STRATEGIES TO SEE OUR CLUBS GROW AND PROSPER.

ONE OF OUR KEY STRATEGIC PRIORITIES IS COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT WITH A FOCUS TO RAISE AWARENESS OF AUSTRALIAN RULES FOOTBALL, SPECIFICALLY AROUND THE CLUBS IN THE EXTREME MULTICULTURAL COMMUNITY AREAS. SEVERAL OF OUR CLUBS ARE ON THE PRECIPICE AND THE COLLECTIVE SURVIVAL OF THESE CLUBS WILL BE DEPENDANT ON THEIR ABILITY TO TRULY CONNECT WITH THEIR MULTICULTURAL COMMUNITIES. MY ROLE IS TO ASSIST THEM IN THAT PROCESS. ON THE BACK OF THE WONDERFUL SUPPORT AND FUNDING FROM THE BRIMBANK AND MARIBYRNONG COUNCILS, WE ARE DEVELOPING STAKEHOLDER AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT INITIATIVES THAT WILL ADD SOCIAL VALUE AND SUPPORT PROGRAM ACCESSIBILITY, EQUALITY, AND INCLUSIVE ENVIRONMENTS.

THESE PROGRAMS WILL BE LINKED TO THE WRFL CLUBS THAT ARE NEARBY. TOGETHER WITH AFL VICTORIA, WE HAVE DEVELOPED PROGRAMS THROUGHOUT THE INNER WEST AND PARTS OF WYNDHAM THAT WILL BE OPEN TO ALL BUT TARGETED AT SPECIFIC COMMUNITIES.

THE TRADITIONAL MEANS OF FOOTBALL ENGAGEMENT DOESN'T WORK IN AREAS OF EXTREME CULTURALLY DIVERSE AREAS. WE MUST APPROACH FOOTBALL ENGAGEMENT DIFFERENTLY BY TAKING OUR GAME DIRECTLY TO OUR COMMUNITIES RATHER THAN JUST EXPECTING THEM TO COME TO US.



IT CERTAINLY IS A CHANGING LANDSCAPE. CONNECTING WITH OUR COMMUNITIES IS SO IMPORTANT AND THIS APPROACH WILL HOPEFULLY SEE OUR CLUBS BE MORE REFLECTIVE OF THEIR OWN DEMOGRAPHIC AND AS A RESULT THEY WILL PROSPER AND REMAIN VITAL AND SUSTAINABLE WELL INTO THE FUTURE.

WRFL STAFF ARE ALSO WORKING CLOSELY WITH AFL VICTORIA'S PARTICIPATION REGION STAFF AND THE BENEFITS ARE ALREADY BEING SEEN. BUILDING STRONGER LINKS BETWEEN AUSKICK CENTRES AND LOCAL CLUBS, PROVISION OF ADDITIONAL RESOURCES AND EDUCATION FOR COACHES, CLUB ADMINISTRATORS AND VOLUNTEERS, AND AN INCREASING NUMBER OF TARGETED PROGRAMS INTRODUCING THE GAME IN SCHOOLS, MOSQUES, AND PLACES OF WORSHIP THROUGHOUT THE WEST.

WHILE SOME GOALS HAVE BEEN ACHIEVED THE RESULTS OF THIS DEVELOPMENT WORK WILL BECOME MORE OBVIOUS GOING FORWARD WITH IMPROVED STABILITY BACK IN OUR SOCIETY AND CLUBS AND CLEARER PATHWAYS FOR PLAYERS FROM INTRODUCTORY PROGRAMS TO CLUB FOOTBALL. I LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING ALONGSIDE EVERYONE AND ENCOURAGE ANYONE TO REACH OUT WHERE WE MAY BE ABLE TO ASSIST.

HOWEVER, OVER THE COURSE OF THIS SEASON WE WORKED ON DEVELOPING OUR JUNIOR UMPIRES AS UMPIRE NUMBERS REDUCED FROM THE PREVIOUS SEASON. THIS HAD AN IMPACT ON CLUBS WHO WERE THEN PLACED IN A POSITION TO FIND AN UMPIRE FOR THEIR GAME WHEN THEY WERE ALSO FACING REDUCED PLAYER NUMBERS.

WE ESTABLISHED A COMMUNITY UMPIRING TALENT ACADEMY, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE NAB LEAGUE WESTERN JETS, FOR YOUNGER UMPIRES WHO ASPIRE TO UMPIRE IN THE VFL AND HIGHER. THESE YOUNG UMPIRES WERE THEN PROVIDED THE OPPORTUNITY TO UMPIRE WESTERN JETS PRACTICE MATCHES PRE-SEASON AND THEY

THEN UMPIRED IN VFLW AND NAB LEAGUE GIRLS AND BOYS GAMES EARLY IN THE 2021 SEASON. THEY ALSO UMPIRED WITH VFL DEVELOPMENT UMPIRES ALLOWING THEM TO ENHANCE THEIR SKILLS.

ONGOING SKILLS SESSIONS WERE RUN PHYSICALLY IN THE PRESEASON WHILST ONLINE SESSIONS WERE HELD WITH CURRENT AFL UMPIRES AROUND LEADERSHIP, GOAL SETTING, FITNESS AND DIET. THE SKILLS DEVELOPED IN THE ACADEMY WILL BENEFIT THE WRFL AS THOSE UMPIRES CONTINUE TO IMPROVE THEIR UMPIRING SKILLS WHICH IN TURN IMPROVES THE OVERALL STANDARD OF FOOTBALL IN THE WRFL.

WE HAD A NUMBER OF NEW COACHES AND OBSERVERS ADDED TO THE UMPIRING DEPARTMENT WHICH AGAIN PROVIDED ONGOING FEEDBACK TO ALL UMPIRES, ALLOWING THEM TO FURTHER DEVELOP THEIR UMPIRING SKILLS.

OUR CHALLENGE IS TO GROW OUR UMPIRING GROUP. THE WRFL HAVE SUPPORTED AN EX-PLAYER PROGRAM INTO UMPIRING AND THIS WILL CONTINUE AS A NUMBER OF EX-PLAYERS HAVE ENJOYED BEING INVOLVED WITH THE UMPIRING FRATERNITY. CLEARLY VERY DIFFERENT TO PLAYING BUT IF YOU HAVE HAD ENOUGH OF WAKING UP EVERY SUNDAY FEELING BATTERED AND BRUISED THEN UMPIRING ALLOWS YOU TO STILL BE INVOLVED IN FOOTBALL, KEEP OR IMPROVE YOUR FITNESS, AND GET PAID.

THE WRFL UMPIRES UTILISE WRFL TV, ALLOWING US TO SHOW GAMEDAY VISION IN A COACHING SESSION AGAIN TO FURTHER DEVELOP OUR SKILLS. WE WERE ALSO ABLE TO RECORD VISION AT TRAINING AND THEN USE THAT VISION AS A COACHING TOOL FOR THOSE WHO COULD NOT MAKE IT TO TRAINING AND FURTHER REFINE WHAT WAS REQUIRED IN SEASON 2021 IN PARTICULAR THE NEW STAND AND 15M KICK IN RULE.

THERE HAS BEEN A SIGNIFICANT NUMBER OF CHANGES TO THE RULES FROM 2019 TO 2021, SO THREE SEASONS BUT ONLY 1.6 SEASONS TO PLAY WITHIN THOSE CHANGES.

CREDIT TO EVERY CLUB AS THEY HAVE EMBRACED AND WORKED WITH US TO ENSURE A SMOOTH AS POSSIBLE TRANSITION ACROSS ALL GRADES.

THERE WAS A TOTAL OF 58 CHARGES LAID (SET PENALTIES AND TRIBUNAL APPEARANCES). PLAYERS AND OFFICIALS WERE SUSPENDED FOR A TOTAL OF 203 GAMES.

OF THE 203 GAMES IMPOSED, 55 **GAMES (27%) RELATED TO**

SUSPENSIONS GIVEN TO TWO SPECTATORS AND 77 GAMES (38%) RELATED TO SUSPENSIONS GIVEN TO SIX OFFICIALS ON 10 CHARGES FOR INCIDENTS THAT OCCURRED OVER SIX GAMES.

THE SUSPENSIONS HANDED DOWN TO THESE SPECTATORS AND OFFICIALS REPRESENT 65% OF THE TOTAL SUSPENSIONS HANDED OUT ACROSS THE LEAGUE.

STRIKING OR ATTEMPTING TO STRIKE WAS THE MOST COMMON OFFENCE (41%). DOWN FROM 57% ON 2019.

UMPIRE RELATED OFFENCES REPRESENTED 14%. UP FROM 9% ON 2019.
