

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

WELCOME TO THE 2022 ANNUAL REPORT OF THE WESTERN REGION FOOTBALL LEAGUE.

I AM PLEASED TO BE WRITING TO YOU AFTER THE SUCCESSFUL CONCLUSION OF OUR FIRST COMPLETE SEASON IN THREE YEARS.

AFTER TWO YEARS OF MUCH UNCERTAINTY AND UNPRECEDENTED CHALLENGES, IT WAS GREAT TO BE ABLE TO CELEBRATE OUR FOOTBALL AND NETBALL COMPETITIONS AT JUNIOR AND SENIOR LEVEL. THE PAST TWO YEARS HAVE HIGHLIGHTED THE IMPORTANCE OF THE WRFL TO THE COMMUNITIES IN THE WEST. AS SOCIAL CONNECTION AND PARTICIPATION IN TEAM ACTIVITIES IS SO VITAL FOR OUR PHYSICAL AND MENTAL HEALTH.

I AM PLEASED TO SAY THAT THE WRFL HAS EMERGED AS A STRONG AND FINANCIALLY VIABLE ORGANISATION AND WHILE SOME CHALLENGES CONTINUE AS A RESULT OF THE PAST TWO YEARS, WE ARE CONFIDENT WE WILL CONTINUE TO GROW AND HAVE THE LEADERSHIP TO SUSTAIN A SUCCESSFUL COMPETITION.

MOVING FORWARD

THROUGHOUT THIS YEAR, THE WRFL BOARD FOCUSSED ON THE LEAGUE'S STRATEGIC DIRECTION FOR THE NEXT THREE-TO-SEVEN YEARS. THE KEY FACTORS WHICH WILL DRIVE OUR REFRESHED WRFL STRATEGIC PLAN ARE:

- THE CHANGING DEMOGRAPHICS OF THE WESTERN SUBURBS AND HOW TO ATTRACT GROW PARTICIPATION FROM OUR DIVERSE AND MULTICULTURAL COMMUNITIES,
- THE DISRUPTION AND OPPORTUNITIES OF THE DIGITAL AGE AND HOW YOUNG PEOPLE ARE INTERACTING WITH SPORT VIA DIGITAL/SOCIAL MEDIA, AND
- OUR SOCIAL LICENSE TO OPERATE ENSURING THE WRFL PROVIDES A SAFE AND INCLUSIVE ENVIRONMENT FOR ALL - NO MATTER WHAT GENDER, RACE/CULTURAL BACKGROUND OR SEXUAL ORIENTATION.

IN CONJUNCTION WITH OUR MANY STAKEHOLDERS - CLUBS, STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, AFL VICTORIA, NETBALL VICTORIA AND OUR PARTNERS WE HAVE KICKED OFF THE REFRESH OF THE WRFL STRATEGIC PLAN AND IT WILL BE FINALISED EARLY IN 2023.

RESPECTFUL AND SAFE ENVIRONMENT FOR ALL

DURING THE YEAR, WE HAVE ALL READ ABOUT SEVERAL CONCERNING SITUATIONS INVOLVING POOR CULTURE AND BEHAVIOURS IN FOOTBALL, NETBALL, AND OTHER SPORTING COMPETITIONS.

THESE TYPES OF BEHAVIOURS ARE NEVER JUSTIFIED AND MUST NOT BE TOLERATED IN ANY SPORTING COMPETITION FROM ELITE TO GRASSROOTS ASSOCIATIONS.

THE WRFL BOARD AND CEO ARE COMMITTED TO ENSURING THAT WE PROVIDE "A SAFE AND INCLUSIVE ENVIRONMENT - FOR ALL - NOT MATTER GENDER, RACE. CULTURAL BACKGROUND. SEXUAL ORIENTATION".

WE HAVE AND WILL CONTINUE TO COMMIT MONEY AND RESOURCES TO COACH AND PLAYER EDUCATION ON DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION, DEVELOPMENT OF MULTICULTURAL AND DIVERSE CULTURE INITIATIVES TO INCREASE INVOLVEMENT IN THE LEAGUE. WE ALSO HAVE ZERO TOLERANCE TO ABUSIVE OR DISCRIMINATORY BEHAVIOUR BY ANYONE INVOLVED IN THE LEAGUE INCLUDING SPECTATORS. WE HAVE ACTED THIS YEAR AND WILL DO SO GOING FORWARD.

THE BOARD AND CEO ARE NOT ALONE IN CREATING THIS ENVIRONMENT. WE NEED ALL OF THE WRFL COMMUNITY TO TREAT EVERYONE WITH RESPECT AND TO MAKE OUR PLAYING AND SOCIAL ENVIRONMENTS SAFE FOR ALL WHO PARTICIPATE AND ATTEND.

WE HAVE LOTS TO BE PROUD OF IN THE WRFL HOWEVER WE CAN ALWAYS LEARN AND IMPROVE OUR CULTURE AND BEHAVIOUR. THANK YOU FOR BEING PART OF LEADING THIS ONGOING CHANGE.

WE ARE ALSO FAREWELLING TWO LONG STANDING WRFL BOARD MEMBERS - GINA SMITH AND PAUL ROBINSON WHO FINISH THEIR TERMS AT THE END OF THIS YEAR. GINA HAS BEEN A BOARD MEMBER SINCE 2012 AND HAS USED HER SIGNIFICANT SPORTS ADMINISTRATION EXPERIENCE TO SUPPORT THE LEAGUE'S DEVELOPMENT OVER THIS TIME.

CEO REPORT

2022 SAW THE WELCOME RETURN OF SOME NORMALITY, WITH A SEASON PUNCTUATED BY COMPELLING STORIES. AND AFTER WHAT WAS EFFECTIVELY A THREE-YEAR ABSENCE, THIS SEASON'S STORIES WERE MADE ALL THE RICHER FOR THE FACT THAT SO FEW STORIES WERE TOLD THESE PAST THREE YEARS.

THERE'S THE STORY OF CAROLINE SPRINGS AND POINT COOK CENTRALS WHO CLAIMED THE VICTORIA UNIVERSITY POLYTECHNIC SENIOR WOMEN'S DIVISION 1 AND DIVISION 2 PREMIERSHIPS RESPECTIVELY – PREMIERSHIPS THAT 10 YEARS AGO, EXISTED ONLY IN THE IMAGINATIONS OF THOSE WHO WOULD GO ON TO BECOME THE TRAILBLAZERS OF OUR WOMEN'S GAME.

SIMILARLY, FIVE NETBALL PREMIERSHIPS – ONE TO SPOTSWOOD, TWO TO MANOR LAKES AND TWO TO ALBANVALE, WERE MADE ALL THE MORE SIGNIFICANT BY THE FACT THE COMPETITION DIDN'T EXIST UNTIL FIVE YEARS AGO, THE LEAGUE'S 88TH YEAR.

THERE'S THE STORY OF BRAYBROOK, WHO AS HISTORY SHOWS, NOT FOR THE FIRST TIME EMERGED VICTORIOUS AFTER A PERIOD OF SIGNIFICANT WORLD AND IN TURN LEAGUE UPHEAVAL, JUST AS THE CLUB DID WHEN IT CLAIMED THE POST-WAR PREMIERSHIPS OF 1944. 45 AND 46.

THERE WAS THE ONE ABOUT POINT COOK CENTRALS, WHO IN JUST THEIR SECOND FULL SEASON OF DIVISION 2 WENT UNDEFEATED IN CLAIMING THE CLUB'S SECOND SENIOR MEN'S FLAG IN FIVE YEARS.

AND THEN THERE WAS THE VIKINGS, WHO RECEIVED DUE REWARD FOR A SUSTAINED PERIOD OF SUCCESS, THEIR WIN SIGNALLING A CHANGING OF THE GUARD.

IF THE LAST FEW YEARS HAVE TAUGHT US NOTHING ELSE, IT'S THAT CHANGE IS INEVITABLE. TWO CLUBS WILL JOIN THE COMPETITION NEXT YEAR, WHILE AT THE SAME TIME IT IS POSSIBLE OTHERS MAY EXIT. THOSE EVEN VAGUELY FAMILIAR WITH THE HISTORY OF THE LEAGUE WILL APPRECIATE THAT THERE HAS ALWAYS BEEN A DEGREE OF FLUIDITY TO THE COMPETITION AND ITS MAKE-UP SINCE EIGHT CLUBS FORMED THE LEAGUE IN 1931. IF YOU TRACE BACK TO THOSE ORIGINS AND JUMP FORWARD IN 30-YEAR INCREMENTS TO TODAY, THE COMPETITION HAS LOOKED MATERIALLY DIFFERENT IN EACH INSTANCE. JUMP FORWARD ANOTHER 30 YEARS FROM TODAY AND I'M SURE THE SAME WILL BE SAID AGAIN. THE ONE CONSTANT IS THE LEAGUE ITSELF.

FOR THOSE A PART OF IT, I HAVE FULL FAITH THE BOARD AND ADMINISTRATION WILL CONTINUE TO WORK TIRELESSLY TO ENHANCE THE LEAGUE'S IMAGE, REPUTATION AND PRODUCT FOR THE BENEFIT OF ALL INVOLVED AND THE COMMUNITY WE COLLECTIVELY REPRESENT.

HAVING WORKED IN FOOTBALL FOR A DECADE, I CAN CATEGORICALLY SAY THAT THERE IS NO LEAGUE ADMINISTRATION I HAVE SEEN THAT WORKS HARDER OR CARES MORE DEEPLY FOR ITS ORGANISATION.

THAT SAID, THE BROADER COMMUNITY FOOTBALL LANDSCAPE IS CHANGING TOO, EVER CALLING ON US TO DO AND BE MORE. IN THE ABSENCE OF DEFINED BOUNDARIES OR TERRITORIES, INCREASINGLY AGGRESSIVE GROWTH STRATEGIES ARE BEING ADOPTED THAT DO NOT NECESSARILY FOCUS ON BUILDING FROM WITHIN. THIS INCREASING TENDENCY ONLY CALLS FOR OUR LEAGUE TO UP THE ANTE IN TERMS OF OUR GROWTH STRATEGY IN THE MONTHS AND SEASONS TO COME.

WHILE THE LEAGUE'S LONG-TERM GROWTH STRATEGY IS MULTIDIMENSIONAL, I SEE FIRST-HAND THE INCREASINGLY SIGNIFICANT ROLE
THAT NETBALL IS PLAYING IN OUR LEAGUE NOT ONLY GROWING FROM
WITHIN, BUT ALSO IN BEING VIEWED AS AN INCREASINGLY ATTRACTIVE
ALTERNATIVE FOR CLUBS CURRENTLY COMPETING ELSEWHERE - CLUBS
THAT I WOULD CONSIDER VERY MUCH IN OUR PATCH. HOW THE NETBALL
COMPETITION LOOKS IN FIVE YEARS COULD WELL BE VASTLY DIFFERENT TO
HOW IT LOOKS TODAY, AND AS HAS ALWAYS BEEN THE CASE, WILL BE
SHAPED IN COLLABORATION WITH ITS COMPETING CLUBS.

RECOGNISING THE EVOLVING NATURE OF OUR NETBALL COMPETITION AND ITS INCREASING IMPORTANCE TO OUR DNA, CLUBS WILL AT SOME STAGE LIKELY BE FORMALLY ASKED TO CONSIDER A BRAND CHANGE – FROM THE WRFL, TO THE WFNL, OR WESTERN FOOTBALL NETBALL LEAGUE. MAKE NO MISTAKE, WHILE PERHAPS NOT OBVIOUS ON THE SURFACE, THE POTENTIAL BENEFITS THIS RELATIVELY SUBTLE ONE-WORD REPLACEMENT WOULD BRING ARE PROFOUND AND MULTI-LAYERED.

WHILE I WRITE OF THE FUTURE AND WHAT WILL BE, IT IS EQUALLY IMPORTANT TO REFLECT ON WHAT WAS, AS WE CELEBRATE THIS, THE LEAGUE'S 92ND YEAR. THIS ALSO MARKS MY FINAL ANNUAL REPORT AS I MOVE ON TO ANOTHER OPPORTUNITY, AND SO TO MY TEAM IN STEPH, JESSIE, KRISTEN, KRISTY, GARY, DOM, KELLY & PETE, THANK YOU FOR YOUR WORK AND SUPPORT THIS YEAR AS ALWAYS, AS WELL AS MEREDITH AND THE ENTIRE BOARD. I HAVE ENJOYED MY TIME AT THE WRFL IMMENSELY.

2021 BROUGHT ALONG COUNTLESS CHALLENGES AND MULTIPLE RESTRUCTURES OF COMPETITION FIXTURES WHICH EVENTUALLY MADE IT IMPOSSIBLE TO COMPLETE THE SEASON. FOR THE FIRST TIME IN TWO YEARS THE WRFL COMMUNITY WERE EXCITED, PASSIONATE, AND EAGER TO EXPERIENCE A COMPLETED 2022 SEASON AND WHAT A FANTASTIC YEAR IT WAS.

SENIOR MEN'S FOOTBALL

CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL OUR SENIOR AND RESERVE MEN'S PREMIERSHIP TEAMS, WITH A SPECIAL MENTION TO THE ALTONA FOOTBALL CLUB ON BEING CROWNED THE TIV SENIOR DIVISION 1 PREMIERS, BOOK ENDING DEER PARK'S HISTORIC PREMIERSHIP RUN AFTER LAST WINNING THE FLAG IN 2012.

CONGRATULATIONS TO POINT COOK CENTRALS, CAPPING OFF AN OUTSTANDING YEAR WITH AN UNDEFEATED SEASON IN DIVISION 2 GRAND FINAL AND OUR ALAN MANCE MOTORS SENIOR DIVISION 3 PREMIERS IN BRAYBROOK, WHO WENT INTO THE GRAND FINAL AS UNDERDOGS, BUT SCORED A THRILLING TWO-POINT VICTORY OVER THE SUNS.

FINALS FOR OUR SENIOR MEN'S COMPETITIONS WERE HELD AT THREE VENUES ACROSS THE WRFL REGION, AVALON AIRPORT OVAL, PENNELL RESERVE AND YARRAVILLE OVAL. SENIOR WOMEN'S FOOTBALL

FOR THE FIRST TIME IN OUR LEAGUES HISTORY, WE BRANCHED INTO TWO VERY COMPETITIVE SENIOR WOMEN'S DIVISIONS.



THE GROWING NUMBER OF CLUBS GETTING INVOLVED IN THE VICTORIA UNIVERSITY WRFL NETBALL COMPETITION IS ONE TO CELEBRATE WITH A 17% INCREASE IN TEAMS FROM 2021 TO 2022 AND AN OVERALL INCREASE OF 94% FROM OUR LAST FULL SEASON IN 2019.

AFTER THE PREVIOUS TWO YEARS OF COVID DISRUPTION, 2022 WAS A YEAR OF CONSOLIDATION. SUPPORT, RECONNECTION. AND REBUILDING.

I WOULD LIKE TO ACKNOWLEDGE OUR WONDERFUL CLUBS, THEIR COMMITTEES, VOLUNTEERS, AND UMPIRES FOR ALL THE WORK YOU DO SO ALL PARTICIPANTS CAN ENJOY FOOTBALL EVERY WEEK. IT IS THESE INDIVIDUALS THAT FORM THE FABRIC OF EACH CLUB AND MAKE AUSTRALIAN FOOTBALL THE GREAT GAME IT IS.

THE WRFL UNDERSTANDS THAT VOLUNTEERISM AND RETAINING THEM HAS BEEN CHALLENGING OVER THE PAST TWO YEARS. OUR AIM IS TO CONTINUE TO SUPPORT CLUBS WHERE WE CAN VIA TRAINING AND EDUCATION, RECOGNITION AND REDUCING THE VOLUNTEER LOAD.

THROUGHOUT MARCH AND APRIL, WE RAN FOUR 'COACHES' NIGHTS' AND A 'COACHING COORDINATOR' NIGHT WITH MORE THAN 250 PEOPLE IN ATTENDANCE ACROSS THE EVENTS.

COACH EDUCATION WAS A KEY FOCUS FOR THE WRFL IN 2022

WE OUTLINED HOW SERIOUS WE ARE ABOUT SUPPORTING AND DEVELOPING OUR COACHES AND ENSURING THAT ALL COACHES ARE CONDUCTING THEMSELVES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE 'CODE OF CONDUCT' AND ALWAYS REPRESENTING THE CLUBS AND THE LEAGUE IN AN EXEMPLARY MANNER. WE COULD NOT HAVE BEEN CLEARER ON OUR EXPECTATIONS OF COACHES IN 2022 AND THE IMPACT THEY HAVE ON THE BEHAVIOUR OF SUPPORT STAFF, CLUB OFFICIALS, SPECTATORS, AND PARENTS. WE DID SEE AN IMPROVEMENT ACROSS THE BOARD, BUT WE STILL HAVE SOME WORK TO DO IN THIS AREA.

THE WRFL ALSO FACILITATED THREE 'COACH FOR GROWTH' SESSIONS FOR OUR COACHES COVERING 'IMPROVING THE KICKING SKILLS OF YOUR PLAYERS', 'VFL MATCH REVIEW & DRILLS SESSION WITH THE WERRIBEE FC SQUAD' AND A 'COACHING PHILOSOPHY AND STRUCTURE SESSION WITH THE WESTERN JETS'. COACH DEVELOPER SHANE MORWOOD ALSO CONDUCTED 'COACH FOR GROWTH' SESSIONS AT NINE OF OUR CLUBS.

CLUB SUPPORT, PARTICIPATION & COMMUNITY

THE WRFL WORKED CLOSELY WITH SEVERAL OF OUR CLUBS IN 2022 PROVIDING ONGOING SUPPORT AND ASSISTANCE WITH LONG TERM PLANNING, STRATEGIC DIRECTION, GENERAL HEATH CHECKS, STRATEGIC COMMUNITY INVESTMENT FUND FUNDING, GRANT ADVICE AND COMMUNITY PROFILING.

IN COLLABORATION WITH AFL VICTORIA, WE CONTINUE TO OFFER OPPORTUNITIES AND PROGRAMS FOR MANY OF THE UNDERREPRESENTED COMMUNITIES IN THE WEST AND WE ARE CHALLENGING OURSELVES TO WORK WITH SEVERAL COMMUNITY GROUPS AND EXPERT PROVIDERS TO EMBRACE THESE OPPORTUNITIES AND BRIDGE THE GAP BETWEEN OUR STRUCTURED SYSTEM AND THE UNAFFILIATED GROUPS AND INDIVIDUALS PLAYING OUR GAME.

THE THREE AUSKICK TO JUNIOR TRANSITION DAYS HELD IN SEPTEMBER WERE VERY SUCCESSFUL WITH MORE THAN 180 ASPIRING YOUNG JUNIOR FOOTBALLERS ATTENDING FROM 15 AUSKICK CENTRES. THESE DAYS ARE CRITICAL FOR OUR CLUBS TO ATTEND AS IT ENSURES A SEAMLESS TRANSITION, AN OPPORTUNITY TO COMMUNICATE AND MEET WITH PARENTS, PROMOTE YOUR CLUB AND THUS FORMING A STRONG BASE OF PLAYERS ENTERING UNDER 8'S, 9'S AND 10'S.

WE LOOK FORWARD TO FURTHER STRENGTHENING OUR COACH EDUCATION PROGRAMS INTO 2023 AND THE LINK BETWEEN AUSKICK CENTRES AND CLUBS TO ENSURE A REGULAR AND CONSTANT STREAM OF PLAYERS INTO OUR MEMBER CLUBS THUS ENSURING SUSTAINABILITY AND VIABILITY WELL INTO THE FUTURE.

AFL VICTORIA REPORT

2022 WAS A VERY POSITIVE YEAR AS IT WAS ENCOURAGING TO SEE SO MANY CLUBS BOUNCE BACK AFTER TWO COVID AFFECTED SEASONS.

THERE WERE SOME GREAT PARTICIPATION PROGRAMS RUN OVER THE COURSE OF THE YEAR WITH AUSKICK, PRIMARY PLAY, FOOTY4FUN PROGRAMS (COME AND TRY, INCLUSION, ALL GIRLS AND MULTICULTURAL) AND AUSKICK TRANSITION CARNIVALS HELD.

AFL VICTORIA ALSO INTRODUCED KINDER PLAY, A NEW KINDER PROGRAM WHICH FOCUSES ON TARGETING THE NEXT GROUP OF 4-YEAR OLD'S COMING THROUGH TO SIGN UP FOR AUSKICK AS WELL AS THE LAUNCH OF SOCIAL HUBS WHICH RAN JUNIOR X AND AFL 9'S COMPETITIONS.

THERE WERE 2866 TOTAL AUSKICK REGISTRATIONS ACROSS THE REGION IN 2022, WHICH WAS SLIGHTLY DOWN FROM 2021 AS AUSKICK CENTRE'S BOUNCED BACK FROM COVID. THE INNER-WEST CONTRIBUTED 1133 PARTICIPANTS, WITH THE SOUTH-WEST CONTRIBUTING 1733 PARTICIPANTS.

WE ARE LOOKING FORWARD TO WORKING WITH ALL OUR AUSKICK CENTRES AND JUNIOR CLUBS IN 2023 AND KEEPING THE MOMENTUM GOING.

AFL VICTORIA HELD THREE TRANSITION CARNIVALS ACROSS THE REGION, WITH A FOCUS ON TRANSITIONING AUSKICKERS INTO THEIR NEXT PHASE OF THEIR FOOTBALL JOURNEY AT JUNIOR CLUBS. THE CARNIVALS WERE HELD AT MCIVOR RESERVE IN YARRAVILLE, JK GRANT RESERVE IN ALTONA AND GALVIN PARK RESERVE IN WERRIBEE WITH 180 PARTICIPANTS ACROSS THE THREE LOCATIONS.

AUSKICK PLUS WAS INTRODUCED IN TERM 3, THIS BRINGS FOOTY TO NEW PARTICIPANTS THAT CAN'T ATTEND DURING WEEKENDS OR ARE PLAYING OTHER SPORTS. THREE CENTRES WERE CREATED AT SACRED HEART SCHOOL IN ST ALBANS, ARDEER SOUTH PRIMARY SCHOOL, AND TARNEIT RISE PRIMARY SCHOOL.

MORE THAN 100 PARTICIPANTS ATTENDED THE AUSKICK PLUS CENTRES WITH 33% BEING FEMALE AND WITH 84% OF PARTICIPANTS HAVING A PARENT BORN OVERSEAS.

AUSKICK CENTRES ACROSS THE REGION WERE ALSO LUCKY TO TAKE PART IN HALF-TIME AUSKICK AT THE MCG AND MARVEL STADIUM.

THERE WAS ALSO A SLIGHT INCREASE IN THE WRFL JUNIOR NUMBERS IN 2022 WITH 2597 PARTICIPANTS ACROSS THE 8-12 AGE GROUP. FEMALE PARTICIPATION IN THIS AGE BRACKET ALSO INCREASED 10% TO 317 PARTICIPANTS FROM 2021 AMONGST THE SAME AGE GROUPS.

THE LAUNCH OF AFL VICTORIA SOCIAL HUBS HAS BEEN A GREAT INITIATIVE IN DRAWING NEW EYES TO THE SPORT, WITH 260 PARTICIPANTS ATTENDING THE LAUNCH OF JUNIOR X AT GALVIN PARK RESERVE. OF THESE PARTICIPANTS, 58, HADN'T REGISTERED TO AUSKICK OR JUNIOR FOOTBALL IN 2022. THERE WERE 20 TEAMS COMPETING ACROSS THE 4-WEEK COMPETITION. WE ALSO HAD 40 GIRLS ATTEND AN ALL-GIRLS ROUND WITH FOUR TEAMS COMPETING.

260 PARTICIPANTS ACROSS THE REGION TOOK PART IN JUNIOR X

AFL VICTORIA HAVE SINCE LAUNCHED SOCIAL HUBS IN FOOTSCRAY PARK, ST ALBANS AND TARNEIT WITH POSITIVE FEEDBACK.

IN 2022, WE COMPLETED 75 PRIMARY PLAY PROGRAMS AT SCHOOLS IN THE WRFL REGION, AS WELL AS COUNTLESS SPORTING SCHOOLS PROGRAMS, WITH FOOTY BEING THE NUMBER ONE PROGRAM IN SCHOOLS THROUGHOUT VICTORIA.

OUR FOOTY4FUN PROGRAMS WHICH CONSISTED OF AUSKICK CARNIVALS, ALL GIRLS SUPERCLINICS, COME AND TRY PROGRAM, MULTICULTURAL PROGRAMS AND INCLUSION PROGRAMS HAD MORE THAN 220 PARTICIPANTS. 98% OF THE GIRLS THAT ATTENDED AN ALL GIRLS COME AND TRY PROGRAM THAN REGISTERED TO AUSKICK FOR THE FOLLOWING SEASON.

WE SAW GREAT GROWTH IN SOME OF OUR ALL-GIRLS AUSKICK GROUPS AT NEWPORT POWER, ALTONA, AND WILLIAMSTOWN.

AFL VICTORIA ALSO ASSISTED BOTH THE NORTH MELBOURNE AND WERRIBEE FOOTBALL CLUBS IN SUPER-CLINICS OVER THE TERM 3 HOLIDAYS WITH MORE THAN 200 PARTICIPANTS ATTENDING TWO CLINICS.

WITH THE IMPLEMENTATION OF OUR CURRENT PROGRAMS AND NEW PROGRAMS BEING INTRODUCED IN 2023, AS WELL AS THE SUPPORT OF SOME FANTASTIC AND FORWARD-THINKING VOLUNTEERS AMONGST OUR CLUBS AND CENTRES, WE ARE TRULY OPTIMISTIC AND EXCITED ABOUT WHAT 2023 WILL BRING.

WE LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING WITH YOU ALL NEXT YEAR AND MAKING SURE THAT "WEST IS BEST" IN 2023.

2022 HAILED THE RETURN TO A COMPLETE FOOTBALL SEASON, THE FIRST IN THREE YEARS. LIKE EVERY PERSON IN COMMUNITY FOOTBALL, THE UMPIRES HAVE ALSO HAD TO ENDURE COMMUNITY FOOTBALL LIKE NEVER BEFORE, BUT IN 2022 WE WERE BACK!

THIS SEASON SAW A NUMBER OF SENIOR UMPIRES NOT RETURNING TO UMPIRING. THIS PROVIDED THE OPPORTUNITY FOR THOSE UMPIRES STRIVING TO OFFICIATE AT THE HIGHEST LEVEL OF FOOTBALL, A CHANCE TO SHINE. DURING THE COURSE OF THE SEASON MANY UMPIRES DEBUTED IN DIVISION 1 SENIOR FOOTBALL - THIS WILL PLACE THE GROUP WELL MOVING FORWARD.

COME AND TRY PROGRAMS WERE HELD PRE-SEASON RESULTING IN A NEW UMPIRE ACADEMY BEING ESTABLISHED AT HOPPERS CROSSING. WE WERE ABLE TO DEVELOP A GROUP OF YOUNG, NEW UMPIRES INTO VARIOUS DISCIPLINES WITH MANY FIRST-YEAR UMPIRES OFFICIATING IN JUNIOR FINALS AND GRAND FINALS IN THEIR FIRST SEASON. MOVING FORWARD, WITH ONGOING COACHING WE WOULD EXPECT THOSE UMPIRES TO DEVELOP AND MOVE UP THE RANKS.

THE WRFL UMPIRES ASSOCIATION (WRFLUA) PROVIDES AMAZING SUPPORT FOR THE WRFL UMPIRES BY ATTRACTING GRANTS TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR COACHING AND UMPIRE DEVELOPMENT. THE WRFLUA HAS SUPPORTED THE COME AND TRY PROGRAM AND PROVIDED MORE COMMUNICATION HEADSETS, WHICH ARE USED ON GAME DAY, SIMILAR TO THE AFL, WHICH ENHANCES OUR COACHING ABILITY AND FURTHER DEVELOPS THE UMPIRES COMMUNICATION SKILLS.

WRFL UMPIRES WERE PROVIDED THE OPPORTUNITY TO UMPIRE AT VFL WOMEN'S AND NAB U18 BOYS AND GIRLS COMPETITIONS DURING THE SEASON. LIKE PLAYERS, UMPIRES HAVE A PATHWAY TO THE AFL AND THOSE UMPIRES WHO DISPLAY A HIGH LEVEL OF SKILL AND COMMITMENT WERE PROVIDED THAT OPPORTUNITY THROUGH THE WESTERN UMPIRES ACADEMY. IN 2023 THIS WILL FURTHER DEVELOP INCLUDING MORE FEMALE PATHWAYS FOR UMPIRES.

MAREE WILKE (SENIOR BOUNDARY COACH) AND CRAIG GURRIE (ASSISTANT SENIOR BOUNDARY COACH) HAVE DECIDED TO MOVE ON AFTER MANY YEARS IN THE POSITION

MAREE HAS BEEN OUTSTANDING, WORKING AS THE FEMALE LIAISON AND OBSERVING FOR THE PAST 10 SEASONS. SHE WAS SENIOR BOUNDARY COACH FOR THE PAST SIX YEARS AND HER ABILITY TO DEVELOP YOUNG BOUNDARY UMPIRES INTO SENIOR BOUNDARY UMPIRES HAS BEEN EXCELLENT.

CRAIG HAS ASSISTED MAREE OVER THE PAST FOUR SEASONS, AND TOGETHER THEY HAVE DEVELOPED THE BOUNDARY UMPIRES' PANEL TO A VERY HIGH STANDARD. THEIR SHOES WILL BE HARD TO FILL.




