PRESIDENT'S REPORT

DIANA TAYLOR – PRESIDENT

In 2008, the Western Region Football League (WRFL) provided 7,200 players with the opportunity to play Australian Rules Football, and over 20,000 more people with the chance to directly participate in our great game. The WRFL continues to be the largest community sporting organisation in the Western Suburbs, and in 2008 has continued to build its reputation as a community leader for the promotion of health, wellbeing and community engagement.

Before our season even began, the WRFL's Clubs were again faced with the challenges brought about by drought. Now accustomed to the constraints caused by restricted ground usage, Clubs and players devised resourceful and innovative ways in finding alternative training and ground options. While this has been a difficult period for everyone involved, the inter-Club co-operation which has been developed, along with the effective working relationships with the Western Region's local Councils, have been very positive outcomes for the WRFL.

The Senior Competition commenced in magnificent fashion under lights at the St Albans Football Club. The huge crowd at this game was a continuing theme throughout the Season in both the Division 1 and Division 2 Competition. It has been very pleasing this year to see the increased crowd numbers and great support at our Club games, particularly in the Division 2 and Junior Divisions.

In 2008, there have been many big improvers both on and off the field amongst the WRFL's Clubs, and the race to make the Finals Series in both the Junior and Senior Competitions, along with a strongly contested Finals Series itself, was testament to the work and dedication of all our Clubs this season.

After another tightly contested Grand Final against the Port Melbourne Colts Football Club, the Spotswood Football Club became back to back Division 1 Premiers and is to be congratulated for this hard earned achievement. In the Division 1 Reserves Competition,

the Sunshine Football Club took out the premiership over Spotswood and confirmed that they have some great depth of talent moving into 2009. In the Division 2 Competition, we congratulate Sunshine Heights on its Division 2 Premiership over the North Footscray Football Club after a very consistent season. North Footscray is also to be commended after a terrific year of football in contesting the Division 2 Senior Grand Final and winning the Division 2 Reserves Premiership. Great community support was shown throughout the Finals Series and the WRFL enjoyed record crowds with healthy financial results.

The WRFL's Under 18 Competition continues to go from strength to strength and it is very rewarding to see our former Junior players developing at this level of the

Competition. Congratulations to the Werribee Juniors Football Club for their Under 18A and 18B Premierships and to the Parkside Football Club for winning the Under 18C Competition.

The co-ordination and supervision of the Junior Competition is one of the most important functions which is undertaken by the WRFL. In 2008, the WRFL placed its grading system under review to ensure that we retain as many Junior players as possible from year to year, and that all players get as much enjoyment as possible from their footy by playing in an even and competitive environment. The WRFL is continuing to work with the Clubs, AFL Victoria and other Leagues around the State to ensure that we are using the best systems available to maintain and enhance the Junior football environment.

The WRFL has enjoyed extensive media coverage this year through the print, internet and radio arms of its Media Division. Led by Media Manager Kevin Hillier, the stories of the WRFL have been covered with accuracy, colour and importantly, have assisted in illustrating those events which capture the heart and soul of the WRFL. In 2008, the WRFL was the first community football league to launch its own Web TV show through www.wrfl.asn.au and this forum has created another voice for the WRFL and its valued sponsors. Steve Thom, Adam Lux and the WRFL radio team are also to be congratulated on calling another great season of WRFL games.

Our WRFL Umpires, under the guidance of Terry Gunn, Umpires Manager, have also served with distinction in 2008. Umpiring is acknowledged as one of the toughest jobs in football and again this year, this group has made a vital and highly skilled contribution to our game. We also acknowledge the invaluable work of Sam Fenech, President of the WRFL Trainers Association and all the Trainers for the support and expertise that they have brought to the field each week in 2008.

The WRFL Judiciary has again been a fair and independent decision maker in 2008 under the guidance of Dale

Sayner (Tribunal), John Doherty (Appeal Board) and Mark McDonald (Independent Hearing Committee). I thank each of these Chairmen and their Judicial Members for volunteering their time in these invaluable roles this year. I also wish to acknowledge the additional and critical work which Dale Sayner has undertaken in creating community league first training and education programs for Judicial Members, Player Advocates and Umpire Advocates.

The operational and administrative challenges that are part of our growing community organisation are increasing each year. On behalf of the Board and everyone at the WRFL, I wish to acknowledge and thank our dedicated and resourceful administration team of John Batty, Chief Executive Officer, David Newton, General Manager – Football Operations, Ben McManus, Football Operations and Club Development Officer and Stacey Goad, Administration Officer and Events Co-ordinator. We are very fortunate to have such a highly skilled and experienced management team. Their ability to work so effectively with our sponsors, the AFL, AFL Victoria,

State Government, Councils and other football bodies has meant that the WRFL continues to advance in all these areas. The healthy financial position of the WRFL and strong fiscal accountability which has been applied by the WRFL's Administrators and Board in reaching this result will have long term benefits for the WRFL.

I am also immensely grateful to the WRFL Board Members for their dedication, passion and commitment to the WRFL in 2008. Vice-President Stephen Myall, Treasurer Dominic Drenen and Directors Bruce Mildenhall, Andrew Curcio, Janine Mizzi, Gavin Deller, Terry McGarity and John O'Callaghan have all taken on additional responsibilities this year with their chosen Board portfolios. This new direction for the Board has been designed to ensure that not only are accountable and transparent governance processes applied to Board decisions and procedures, but that we make the most of the skills sets of these very talented people.

The WRFL Board and Administration is already looking

forward to 2009 and has begun planning for increased growth and development in key areas across the League. The challenge of the Head office relocation remains, the Women's Football Foundation will be developed into new areas and the competitiveness of the WRFL's Clubs is a key priority. The focus in 2009 will also be heavily centred on ensuring that we improve our family friendly and inclusive environments at Club events and games, and that the highest standards possible are set for WRFL players, participants and spectators. In doing so, the WRFL will continue to strive towards being the number one recreational choice for people in the Western Suburbs of Melbourne.

In conclusion, and as my first year as President of the WRFL draws to a close, I wish to thank the WRFL community for its support and encouragement in 2008. I hope that you enjoy reading this Annual Report and reflecting on the many achievements in 2008, and I look forward to continuing to develop the institution that is the WRFL with you all in the year ahead.



CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

JOHN BATTY – CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

The WRFL 2008 Season has given the entire football community the opportunity to celebrate 150 years of Australian Football.

Australian Rules Football in the Western side of Melbourne continues to thrive.

This is evident from the success of our 2008 season with increasing participation rates of not only those who play the game but also the off ground people who engross themselves in the WRFL environment.

The senior finals series played this year provided record crowds in terms of gate revenue and although marred by an unfortunate conclusion to our Division 1 Grand Final epitomised what our great game should be all about – the excitement of the contest, the joy and often the disappointment that participating in a team game can bring.

The WRFL competition certainly generates a genuine interest and passion by all who are part of our football community.

The junior finals series was testament to this with the biggest winner being junior football itself. It is a sobering thought to realize how important football is to so many people and the benefits we all derive from our involvement.

On numerous occasions in various editorials I have suggested that Football is more than just a game. This continues to be my impression when you consider how our clubs continue to become more substantial organisations. Senior clubs are underpinned by a growing number of junior teams and the many development programs associated with these are producing not only better skilled footballers but more well, rounded young people, better prepared for life in general.

The WRFL and clubs need to continue to become even more aware and accepting of a greater social responsibility. Programs such as Good sports, Quality

Clubs and the Responsible Serving of Alcohol need to be further embraced. This is good for the game and furthers the role that football clubs can play in the development of a harmonious and well adjusted community.

Behavioral standards, in general, are continuing to change in the WRFL.

This year there was an increase in the number of guilty verdicts related to umpire abuse.

On the surface this may not appear a positive thing but further consideration shows that this was a result of a clear direction issued by the League to reduce the level of tolerance of such behavior and by advising our umpires that old standards of player behavior need no longer be considered acceptable.

The quality of the game in the WRFL continues to grow and our desire of maintaining grades where any team can find a place to be competitive remains a clear objective.

This is not always achieved but it is paramount that we continue to strive to maximise the enjoyment of all participants, be it a player, umpire, spectator or volunteer.

VIABILITY

Financially the WRFL is reasonably placed with a significant surplus that has again resulted in a valuable dividend, being returned to financial clubs.

The imminent re-location could prove a costly project and the modest reserves the league hold will undoubtedly help to ensure that the move is in the best interests of all.

It remains a challenge for the league to help keep its clubs strong and viable.

Costs that the WRFL charges to the clubs have been largely stable over the past 3 years and it is pleasing to note that most clubs revenue budgets are meeting their expenditures.

The typical WRFL club has an infinitely different structure to what existed 5 years ago.

The League needs to continue to help clubs with the development of budgets, business plans and protocols.

We consider that these are important services to provide to clubs to help them grow and in future, will need to be made more readily available for those seeking assistance. Well run and highly organised clubs ensures a strong and viable league.

The WRFL has been able to retain a talented base of people dedicated to running the competition. The League's board drives the strategy and focus for the league.

We have a very capable balance of business and sport administration on the board.

The legal council in particular, has proved invaluable, especially with the tenancy issue the league is currently facing.

Our staff is a committed, highly skilled group that continues to establish sound working relationships with clubs and should be commended for the work ethic they constantly display.

BRAND AND REPUTATION

This year the board has made a genuine and concerted effort to launch a strategy for the development of its brand. It may well be a long journey but is one that is already beginning to deliver tangible benefits.

All league stakeholders have a responsibility to contribute to the concept.

It involves many aspects ranging from the way we play the game to how we refer to the WRFL as a competition.

As the equity in our brand grows we'll continue to

build partnerships and become a greater asset to the community.

In 2008 our media operations continued to prosper. The launching of our web TV shows and internet initiatives have been magnificently received and has benefited the league in so many ways.

The challenge for us now is to further commercialise these opportunities that will ensure we are seen as one of the major community sports associations in Australia.

The test will be to ensure that the league offers more to ensure that our clubs remain strong and the competition continues to grow.

A league of this size has an enormous number of people who, by playing their role, ensure that our great game continues to prosper.

My sincere congratulations and thanks is extended to the players, officials, umpires, club staff, generous partners and sponsors and all WRFL supporters in general for their involvement and participation during 2008.

Special thanks go to the President, Diana Taylor and our Board, the administration team, David Newton, Ben McManus, Andrew Muscat, Kevin Hillier, Kathryn Burton, Stacey Goad and Charlie Horvat for all their work over the past twelve months.

Their efforts in continuing to improve the operations of the WRFL, under at times difficult circumstances, are outstanding.

I have thoroughly enjoyed working with this team and wish them all the best for the future. I look forward to working with you all again in season 2009.



FOOTBALL OPERATIONS REPORT

DAVID NEWTON – GENERAL MANAGER – FOOTBALL OPERATIONS

Although the continuing drought conditions again threatened the commencement of the football season it was refreshing to see the 2008 season commence as scheduled. This was highlighted with St Albans hosting Albion under lights as the season opener. The way in which all clubs cooperated with one another to ensure that all matches were played regardless of the high number of venue and time changes was a testament to the strength of our league.

The Under 18 competition continued to strengthen with a total of 24 teams competing across the three grades. This is a great reflection on participation and will only serve to further strengthen our senior competitions in years to come.

The junior season was represented by 26 clubs fielding 170 teams across 19 divisions. Of these 26 clubs, no less than 80% were represented during the finals series with half of these winning premierships. It was encouraging to note that the recently established clubs in Caroline Springs and Point Cook both won their inaugural club premierships. The finals were played over a number of venues and I thank the host clubs for their professionalism in ensuring the finals were a great success.

An important part of the Junior season is always the Interleague and representative program. Following on from the success in 2007, this year eight teams represented the WRFL. Thank you to Ben McManus for all his work with the Interleague program. Thanks also to the coaches, their assistants and officials that make the Interleague program a success.

Season 2008 had many former WRFL players excel at the elite level. Bachar Houli (Essendon/Spotswood), Brent Prismall (Geelong/Werribee Juniors), Albert Proud (Brisbane Lions/Braybrook) and Callan Ward (Western Bulldogs/Spotswood) all played senior football within the AFL. Congratulations to both Mitchell Banner (Werribee Juniors) and Jack Fitzpatrick (Wyndhamvale Juniors) who

both had great seasons with the Jets to enable them the opportunity to represent Victoria Metro at the U'18 National Championships.

The senior competition saw some changes from 2007 with the loss of Brunswick Power and Gladstone Park which created two 10 team competitions within Division 1 and Division 2. The finals series in both competitions were outstanding and culminated in sensational grand final days.

Following on from 2007, the Division 1 Grand Final day which was held at Chirside Park attracted one of the biggest crowds witnessed in the WRFL in many years. The standard of skill and talent on display further enhanced the WRFL as one of the major community leagues within Victoria. Werribee Juniors completed its stellar season with a victory over Altona in the 18A's reversing the result from 2007 and also added to their premiership in the U'18B competition the week before. It was a fitting finale to an outstanding Under 18 season which was highly competitive and played in great spirits all year.

The Reserves match saw Sunshine defeat Spotswood in a thrilling encounter which will make many at Sunshine confident they can be a force at all levels within the WRFL in years to come.

Leading into the 2008 Division 1 Senior Grand Final the previous two Division 1 Senior Grand Finals had been decided by 2 points (2006) and 6 points (2007) which set up great expectation that 2008 would once again be one to remember. As was the case in 2007, Port Melbourne Colts and Spotswood were again successful in making it to the showcase day of the WRFL. In their previous four meetings, all bar one of these matches were decided by one goal or less with Spotswood's only win being the most important of all, the 2007 Grand Final. The 2008 Grand Final was the Port Melbourne Colts fifth consecutive appearance in the WRFL grand final which was an achievement in itself. In what was a classic encounter all day Port Melbourne Colts went into the final quarter

with an 18 point advantage. Spotswood were able to play their best quarter in the most important final quarter to have twelve scoring shots to Port Melbourne Colts' four to run out eventual ten point winners and confirmed the competitions strength with another fantastic Grand Final. This presented Spotswood with Back to Back Division 1 Senior Premierships.

The Division 2 Senior competition was very well contested with eight of the ten teams still vying for a finals berth with two rounds remaining. Sunshine Heights continued on from 2007 and along with North Footscray became the teams to beat throughout the home and away season. It was promising to note the continual improvement of many clubs including the Western Magpies which will ensure the Division 2 competition will thrive in the future. The Division 2 Senior Grand Final was contested between 2007 Grand Finalist Sunshine Heights and the emerging North Footscray. Although Sunshine Heights stunned the crowd jumping out of the blocks to kick four goals to none in the opening term, North Footscray responded quickly in the second to peg the margin back to fourteen points at the main break. The crowd at Chirside Park experienced a highly skilled display in the second half with Sunshine Heights kicking eleven goals to two to run out solid 62 point victors. Congratulations to the committee, coaches and players of the club who have worked very hard to achieve this success, and now look forward to the challenge of division 1 in 2009.

The Division 2 Reserves and Under 18 B grand Final was also played at Chirside Park on Division 2 grand final day with Werribee Juniors overcoming a determined Port Melbourne Colts side in another quality game of football. North Footscray reversed their result of their seniors to defeat Albanvale in the Division 2 Reserves Grand Final in a match which saw the margin at the first three breaks be less than a goal before the eventual premiers ran out 22 point winners. Further to both the Under 18 A & B competitions the Under 18 C Grand Final was played at Altona with Parkside accounting for Western Magpies

in an exciting game of football. The high quality of the Under 18 age group this year is a real positive for WRFL senior football for many years to follow.

Congratulations to all teams who participated in the 2008 finals series and to all those clubs who hosted Junior and Senior finals as it made for an exciting finish to the year.

DEVELOPMENT REPORT

BEN McMANUS – FOOTBALL OPERATIONS AND CLUB DEVELOPMENT OFFICER

It has been an exciting and interesting first year working in the WRFL. The season for the juniors began back in early April culminating in the Fun Day for the U9s and U10s and the Junior Finals series for the U11s through to the U16s.

In the 150th year of Australian Rules football it is important to recognise the army of volunteers that make each season possible. With games stretching across nine municipalities and the ever increasing economic pressures it is a tribute to our clubs and their volunteers that we are able to produce an excellent competition and provide an opportunity for our junior players to continually develop and learn about team spirit and a healthy lifestyle all while having fun playing football. A large part of development in any club is reliant on the volunteers that give up their time to ensure the club can provide a quality service for all its stakeholders.

This year we had twenty seven of our thirty one clubs field teams in the underage competition which is a remarkable effort and a reflection on the population growth in the Western suburbs. Hoppers Crossing, Altona Juniors, Williamstown Juniors, Point Cook and Werribee Juniors fielded a strong presence in the juniors. Despite continued problems with ground availability it is a positive sign that our junior numbers are as strong as ever, giving the WRFL a bright future. Around 80% of our clubs who competed in juniors went on to be represented in the finals and from the fourteen junior premierships on offer, nine different clubs came away with a premiership indicating the evenness of the junior competition across the league. The junior finals itself was again a success from an operations point of view and we saw many closely fought games with impressive displays of skills and spirit despite the inclement weather.

Special mention should go to Point Cook (14D) and Caroline Springs (14B) who won their clubs first ever premierships. This is the result of the hard work from the team and also reward for the committee and volunteers

who hopefully can build on their success and reap more rewards in the future, so congratulations to both clubs.

2008 saw eight teams represent the WRFL at Interleague level with all teams showcasing the best skills and talent that the WRFL has to offer. We had three teams participate in the Victorian Metropolitan Championships.

We had another successful day in the U12s and U13s round robin day. Well done to Steve Turner from RDFL for organising the day. Our U13s came away with a win and a loss. The U12 team came within a whisker of taking home the shield. Each team displayed great spirit.

Our 14 Development Squad trained hard and played a match against the U14 Div 1 RDFL side. The boys fought hard all night and the final score did not reflect their endeavour.

Our 'Go for your life' Metropolitan Championship sides played some of the strongest Junior Leagues in Melbourne including Yarra Juniors, Moorabbin Saints Juniors, Essendon District, Riddell District and Dandenong and Districts Juniors. It was a fantastic learning curve for all involved with the step up between club and Interleague level quite obvious. The U15 Div 1 side had a terrible run

with injury but displayed some real talent which did not go unnoticed. The U15 Div 2 side had a thrilling draw in their final game against the U15 Div 1 RDFL side. The U14 Div 1 side battled hard throughout their three games and should be better for the experience heading into next season's U15 Championships.

The U16 team clashed with the EDFL on a cold night down at Keilor and can consider themselves unlucky not to have won. All players should be proud of the way they performed and the sportsmanship displayed after the match.

The U18 side had two matches. The result was a win against the RDFL and a loss versus the EDFL. The first performance saw a dominant WRFL team outclass the RDFL and run out comfortable winners. While confidence was high after the first match the team found the EDFL a little too strong but demonstrated great fighting spirit until the final siren.

All teams really gelled terrifically in the end and I wish them luck for the remainder of their careers in football.

venues. It was fantastic to see the enthusiasm shown by all the players and great support from all the officials and parents throughout the day.

Club Development has come a long way in the WRFL in the last 10 years and I look forward to continually providing assistance to all our clubs and working with our local council's as we strive to be a benchmark in club administration.

Finally, a big thank you to all people involved in the WRFL who have made this year a welcoming one for myself and I look forward to growing and developing the WRFL next season with the experience gained from this year.



UMPIRES REPORT

TERRY GUNN – MANAGER WRFL UMPIRING DEPARTMENT

I am pleased to Report that it was a very good year for Umpiring. We commenced the 2008 Season with a very similar Team of Coaches as we had in 2007; this is a positive outcome because it maintains a consistent approach to our objectives. I am pleased that again all the Coaches embraced and executed the duties of their positions extremely well. They created a fantastic and “fun” environment for all of our Umpires.

A special mention and thanks to our new Administration Officer, Narelle Lanigan, who brought such a high level of interpersonal skills, professionalism and dedication to our group with her invaluable assistance. Narelle also has the responsibilities of our Female Liaison Officer, by assisting all our young and mature female Umpires with any welfare issues.

SUMMARY OF RESOURCES

- Numbers increased slightly by an additional 6 in the Field group. We managed to supply enough Field Umpires to Umpire all the Senior's and U/18's Divisions and some of the Division 1 Reserves games. However, there is still a high dependence on the “Club Umpires” system to assist in the remaining Reserve Grades in both Divisions. The Field umpires were greatly assisted through the year by Paul Dimartino, Alan Pascoe, Terry McGarity and John Harvey.
- We did recruit very well in the Boundary again this season, under the leadership of Robert Sebbens, with an additional 25 new recruits and therefore covered all the Senior, Reserve games and the overflow into the U/18's. The new recruits were introduced into games that had 3 or 4 Boundaries to assist them to learn their craft. The Boundaries were also assisted to by Greg Haylock and Beau McGarity.
- In the Goal, under the leadership of Kevin McIntyre the numbers increased by 3, and through effective resource management in the system the Reserves and Seniors games were all covered. Sebastian Garro was also a great assistance during the year.
- We also supply Field Umpires to the Sunday Junior competition under the leadership of Phil Henderson and assisted by Dean Portelli and Geoff Tressider. Our numbers increased with 7 new recruits and also another 7 who also performed Boundary duties on a Saturday. We are fortunate that many of our Senior Umpires still assist and do extra games on the Sunday. In a joint campaign with AFL/Vic and the WRFL, it is proposed in 2009 to explore the opportunities of establishing an Umpiring Academy in one of our local Schools located in the growth corridor of our Western Region. Discussions are underway and progressing. This “Academy” has worked effectively in other Leagues.

Our recruitment strategy for assistance from our WRFL Clubs to provide us with “Just One Player per Club per Year”, particularly

targeted to attract any of the U/16's, U/18's and any Seniors who have decided not to return to play football, has not gained the participation as expected. We again appeal to our WRFL Clubs to support this initiative, to advise the WRFL or Umpiring Department of any Players who may not be returning. We will follow them up.

INNOVATIONS

There were quite a number of great ideas during the season some are listed below:

- The umpires selected by their peers to be representatives in the Senior Leadership Groups in each discipline, again worked extremely well.
- The new Boundary Umpire recruits had a “Parents Night”, co-ordinated by the Boundary Coach Robert Sebbens. An informative session was prepared, with guest speakers, such as, our previous umpires who are now at the VFL. They spoke about career opportunities in Umpiring. Food and refreshments were provided and the parents were also thanked for their ongoing support and assistance.
- Promotion and involvement by all of our female Umpire's in the WRFL “Women in Football” functions.
- The opportunity for our Field, Boundary and Goal Umpire's to go to Launceston Tas, Geelong and Albury Leagues, as part of our Umpire interchange program.

KEEPING UP WITH THE TIMES

Following on from last year whereby we introduced 3 Boundary Umpires into the Grand Final in 1st Division. This year we made history in the WRFL, with the introduction of the “AFL 3 Field Umpiring System” into the Division 1 Senior Final Series. This system was successfully trialled and fine tuned during the home and away games. The modern game, the new rules, combined with the WRFL players skill and speed, have necessitated that we must be proactive to provide an additional umpire to be “on the spot” to adjudicate on the contests. Feedback has been fantastic from all Clubs involved. Therefore, it is planned that this 3 Umpire System will remain and possibly be extended into more games and Finals in 2009.

This integrates with part of our general retention strategy and is designed to keep our experienced Umpires in the game longer.

THE FUTURE:

Football Umpiring has it challenges, both on and off the field. It takes a special person to remain in Umpiring. I am so proud of the WRFL group that love their Umpiring with a passion, the involvement and the camaraderie that they all share is second to none.

My Umpiring Department staff work exceptionally hard to create the right environment for our employees. However it is not just up

to us. It is vital that all stakeholders work together to ensure that our efforts are complimented and reinforced when our Umpires go out to perform their duties to the best of their ability. Part of my mission next year will be to liaise even better with our WRFL Clubs, encourage the understanding and enforcement of the Code of Conduct and improve our respect to the game and respect to the Umpire.

Nowadays, there is less focus on just being able to run long distances. We are taking a new holistic approach to the individual's needs, their capabilities, prior experience, general fitness and well being. We will provide the dedicated Theory and Skills training, combined with the AFL Accreditations, by our dedicated and professional Coaching Team.

The WRFL continues to be a feeder of quality Umpires into the VFL ranks. It is pleasing that this year we have sent another 2 of our Umpires (J Walker and D Craig) down to the VFL to try out in the Development Squad. Over the past two years the following umpires (S Jones, D Auciello, B Cryer and M Craig) have been successful and are now Umpiring VFL Football. No doubt that 2009 more of our Umpires will be given this career making opportunity.

Planning is already underway with my Coaching Team and the ongoing challenges that we will embrace in 2009. Our “can do – let's try” strategy will include some of the following;

- Better and more frequent involvement with the Football Clubs
- Introduction of new AFL Uniforms which are modern, comfortable and affordable
- AFL/Vic Umpiring Academy established in the growth corridor of the West
- Umpiring Department staff presenting “Basic Umpiring” clinics in local Schools
- Inviting even more females to participate in the sport and the friendship
- Setting up of additional training venues to assist with recruitment
- Enhancing our efforts to provide the positive environment for learning and fun

Thank you to all the Clubs who provided the hospitality to my Coaching Team and my Umpires during the Season, whether it is at half time at the President's Luncheons or after the game in the Social Club. This personal interaction and networking is encouraged and still remains a valuable part of our game in the WRFL. Well done and keep it up !

Finally, to the WRFL and the Board I valued your continued support of my vision for the West.

Thank you and “Enjoy the Game”.

During season 2008 the tribunal sat on 82 cases of which 77% were guilty verdicts. This is down on the 2007 season where 97 cases were heard. The pleasing part of the season was the reduction in the number of reports applicable to player/player incidents which showed

that the clubs have focused on the on field discipline in this area.

However it is very disappointing that of the 82 reports 42 of these reports were directly related to incidents with umpires by both players and officials. Three of these cases were of a serious nature that required penalties of 12 weeks or more. To have over half the reports applicable to direct umpire involvement sends the wrong message to the WRFL, the umpires association and the community.

This problem lies solely with the clubs; there needs to be strong discipline within the club administration to reduce this type of on field behaviour.

The tribunal next season 2009 will have a zero tolerance on all cases directly involving umpires where the charged is found guilty.

This is the 2nd season of delegate accreditation, we are now seeing an improvement in player and official representation by the tribunal advocates.

During the year we conducted an advocate's night, which was beneficial to all who attended.

Discussions will be held with the WRFL to have more nights next season with less people on each to maximise the help passed on.

I would like to thank the clubs and umpire association for the way the players, officials and umpires presented themselves at the Tribunal during the year.

A special thanks to Brian Wilson who once again held the front desk together throughout the entire season. Brian must be congratulated on his dedication to the WRFL and the tribunal, even though he was ill during the season Brian still attended every Tuesday night.



WRFL WOMEN'S FOOTBALL FOUNDATION REPORT

The WRFL's Women's Football Foundation has enjoyed another great year of success and support from the WRFL and the wider community.

Launched in 2007 by its Patron, the Deputy Prime Minister Julia Gillard MP, the objectives of the Foundation have now been clearly established. These objectives include the increased participation of women and girls in the WRFL, ensuring that this type of participation is enhanced and that opportunities for advancement are made available within the WRFL and its Clubs at any level.

The 2008 season launch of the Women's Football Foundation took place in style with a cocktail party which was held at the Sunshine Golf Club. The evening was attended by a host of special guests, including the WRFL Club and Association Presidents and many of the women from their organisations. The Foundation was delighted to have as its guest speakers Melanie Heenan, Senior Project Officer at the AFL for the Respect & Responsibility Program, Senior Sergeant Dagmar Andersen of Victoria Police and Robyn Gregory, CEO of Women's Health West. There are many challenges and opportunities that continue to await the Women's Football Foundation and I am confident that each of these will be met and embraced by the WRFL. The Foundation is more relevant than ever as we move into the introduction of the AFL's Respect & Responsibility Program at community club level, and the Foundation is looking forward to continuing its development within the WRFL and wider community in 2009.



2008 was another year of growth and development in the WRFL media unit.

Every year we take on new challenges to keep the coverage of the competition fresh and innovative both for our listeners and viewers and also for the small media team.

The most labour intensive and time consuming task is the weekly match day radio broadcast on 88.9 WYN FM. The technical side has to be done before Adam, Steve, Andrew, Charlene and myself then go about presenting all the action with score updates, interviews and more with Travis controlling things in the studio. We rely on the clubs to phone through match reports in the last hour and this year it has been the best yet with the Division 2 Clubs particularly outstanding.

The calling team do a sterling job as we are not afforded elevated positions right in the middle of the ground like commercial radio stations, the difference during the finals at Bartercard Oval was phenomenal. The WYN team- Ray, Stuart, Krume and Tung give their time to deliver the van to the ground and set up all the gear and take it all down after the broadcast. My sincere thanks to them for their enthusiastic attitude to the job every week.

The idea to do a TV show for our website shows that the league is keeping in touch with the new entertainment opportunities that are available. Hopefully this can become a more regular feature on the site in the future.

Werribee Football Club gave us their function room to record the show and Justin Abrams from Red Onion did a great job putting the shows together.

Our relationship with the Star News group has blossomed over the years and the weekly page reaches many more people than a Footy Record would and also exposes the League to many people who never go to a game but still have an interest. The coverage by all local papers was once again mostly excellent, though the feeding frenzy on the back of a few isolated incidents by some reporters was disappointing. They are after all community newspapers.

Steven Milne received the Media Personality of the Year award for his long-standing coverage of local footy. 21 years is a very long time and he deserved the recognition.

The website is the future of the competitions communication and I hope in the future we can stream live broadcasts of our Match of the Day through the site and include podcasts of interviews from the Radio coverage, both from Match days and the Friday Preview show. I would like to see all clubs maintain a website of their own and I would encourage clubs to share the news from their club for the League site. This happens very rarely, which is a shame as the traffic through the League website is large and receptive to news from all clubs.

In 2009 I would like to be able to read the teams out on the Friday Preview Show but that won't happen unless clubs supply the information and realise that there are no trade secrets anymore. In 2009 we will be doing some selected Division 2 games as the Match of the Day. This does make Adam Lux's job more difficult as our main caller but he is a professional in his preparation and will handle it well.

I would like to thank the small but very dedicated media team Adam Lux, Steve Thom, Andrew Muscat, Charlene Gatt and Travis Wheeler. They are great people to work with and very good at what they do.

The other part of my role is as MC for the League events like the season launch, Women's Foundation Night and the Junior and Senior Presentations. Stacey Goad did a great job with the latter two events and I thank her for that.

2008 had its highs and lows but in general it was a good year especially on the field. I look forward to 2009.

As indicated to clubs last year we identified two key areas of specific financial focus for 2007 and I am pleased to report growth in both aspects;

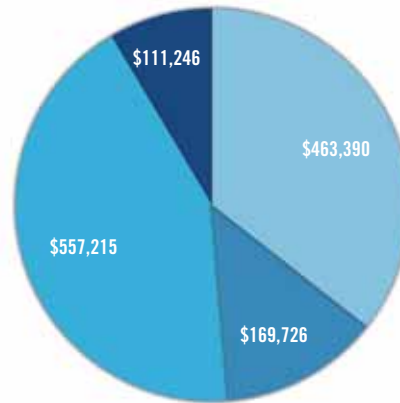

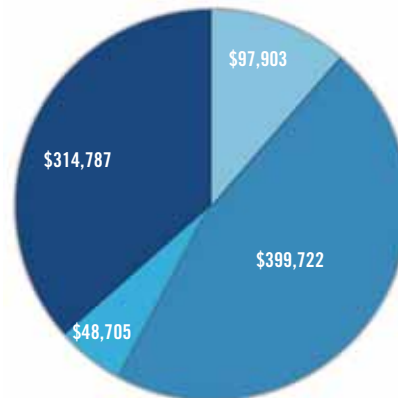
I would particularly like to acknowledge the financial management of John Batty and his team to once again come in under budget for operational expenses for the season.
