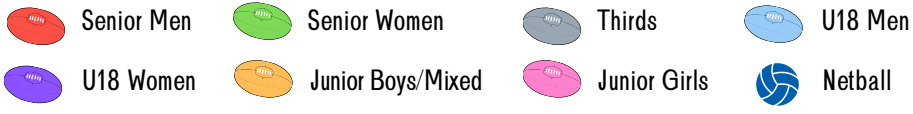
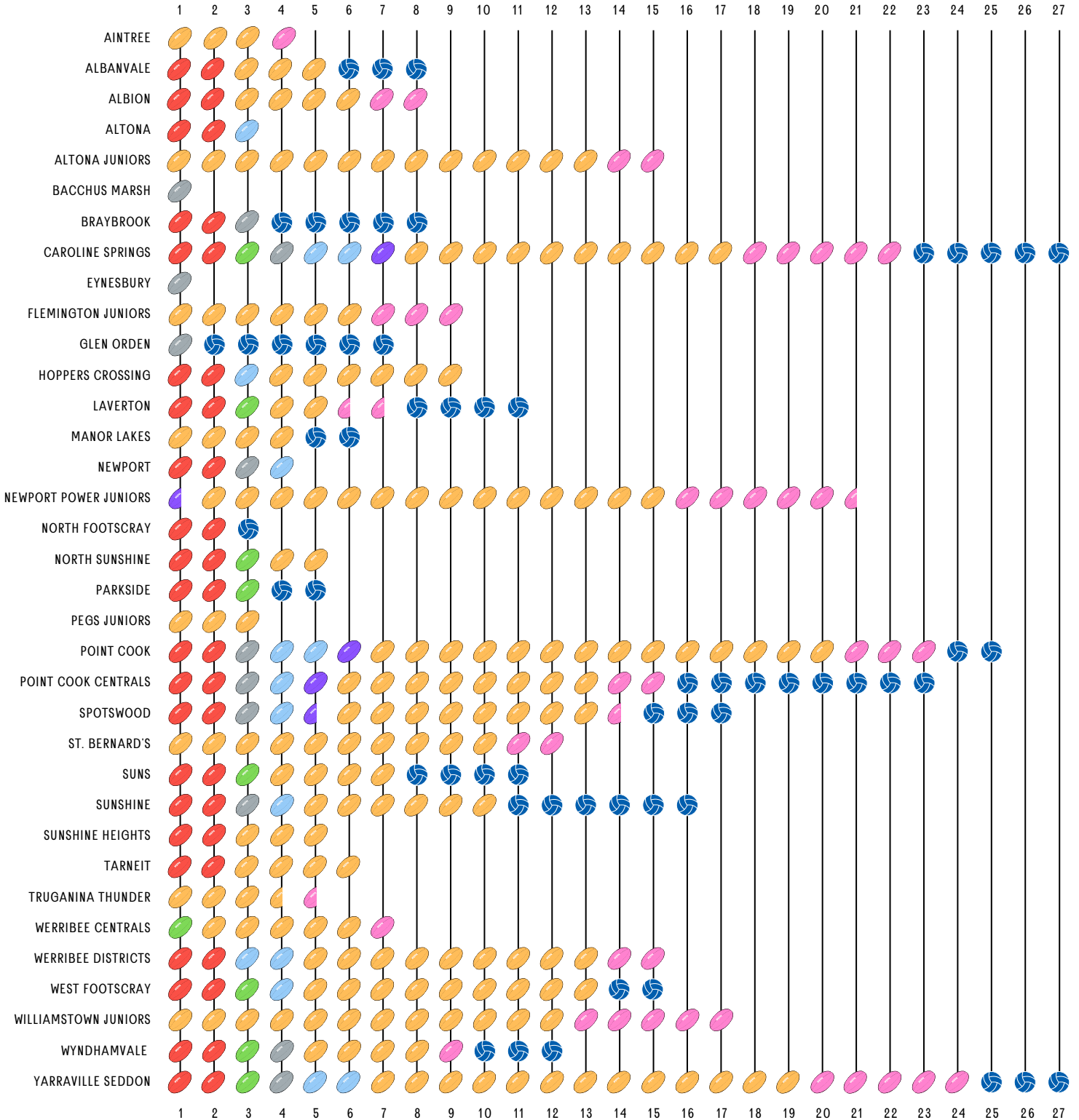

It is my pleasure to present the 2024 Annual Report for the Western Football Netball League (WFNL). This year has been another outstanding chapter for football and netball in Melbourne's west, reflecting our community's passion and the League's sustained growth.

CELEBRATING FOOTBALL AND NETBALL IN THE WEST

In 2024, the WFNL was proud to see vibrant participation across both junior and senior competitions. Our football season showcased 34 clubs with over 4,600 junior players in 224 teams and more than 2,800 senior players across 86 teams. Together, they competed in over 2,300 matches, with 144 finals, all expertly officiated by over 400 dedicated WFNL umpires.

Our League's steady growth is a testament to the community's commitment and love for sport. Junior football has grown by over 10%, with Junior Girls' football expanding by an impressive 60% due to the shift to two-year age groups—rising from 22 to 41 teams in just one year. Senior football also grew by 9.75%, with 86 teams competing, and the success of our Friday night "Thirds" competition has added a new dynamic to the league.

Since introducing the Senior Women's Netball competition in 2017, participation has continued to grow. In 2024, we were thrilled to see just over 1,000 players competing across seven divisions, supported by 40 registered umpires. Half of our clubs now field netball teams, and we are actively working to secure additional court space to meet anticipated growth in 2025.

These numbers highlight our "on field" achievements, but the true impact lies in the community bonds and social value our League fosters across Melbourne's western suburbs, from Footscray to Caroline Springs, from Williamstown and to the Wyndham communities. We estimate that over 250,000 volunteer hours were contributed this season to make these competitions possible, underscoring the integral role of football and netball in the fabric of our community.

GOVERNING THE LEAGUE

The WFNL is governed with a commitment to effective, independent oversight to ensure our League serves the interests of all participating clubs and stakeholders. Decisions are made with a focus on financial sustainability, strategic alignment, legal compliance, and risk management.

Our CEO oversees daily operations and is accountable to the WFNL Board, which meets regularly and provides expert support through the diverse skills and experience of its members. I extend my sincere gratitude to my fellow Board members, who generously volunteer their time to guide our League with integrity and dedication.

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

For the benefit of the League and all affiliated clubs, we have recently entered into a strategic partnership with the Essendon District Football League (EDFL).

This collaboration, fully supported by AFL Victoria, will enhance interleague cooperation, and bring increased stability and opportunity to member clubs. We look forward to building on this partnership for the benefit of our broader football community.

Additionally, we are excited to announce our new partnership with Belgravia Apparel, which will see our netball competition rebranded as the WFNL Belgravia Apparel Netball Competition.

This partnership represents a major milestone in the growth of netball in Melbourne's west, and we anticipate further expansion in teams, umpires, and players in 2025 and beyond.

WE ARE WESTERN

We were thrilled to announce the exciting rebrand of the League from the Western Region Football League (WRFL) to the Western Football Netball League (WFNL). This transformation reflected our growing commitment to fostering both Football and Netball across our vibrant community.

This change marked a new chapter in our 93-year history, one that embraces the future while honouring our proud legacy. We look forward to building a sustainable and thriving future for the WFNL through stronger connections and increased participation.

Not to be outdone, two Member Clubs reached significant milestones in 2024, with the Braybrook Football Club celebrating their 150-year anniversary and the Laverton Football Club reaching their 100-year anniversary. Congratulations to both Clubs and their respective Committees on this milestone.

MORE THAN JUST A COMMUNITY SPORT LEAGUE

The League officially launched the new 2024-2026 WFNL Strategic Plan at the start of 2024 with a bold roadmap that reflects our vision for the future and reinforces our commitment to being 'more than just a community football and netball League'.

The plan focuses on strengthening our role as a cornerstone of community and sport in the west with a clear focus on our Clubs, social connections, participation, our people and culture.

We are deeply invested in promoting health and wellbeing, ensuring that our League continues to be a space where physical, mental, and emotional health are nurtured and supported.

I would like to thank the Pat Cronin Foundation, GenWest, RULE Prostate Cancer, TAC Road Safety and Love the Game for the power of work they are doing in our community. Our commitment to ensuring a safe, fair, welcoming and supportive environment for everyone involved remains steadfast.

As we embark on this exciting new chapter, we look forward to working together with our Clubs, volunteers, participants and partners to bring this vision to life and make the next three years a period of growth, connection, and positive impact for our community.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS OF 2024

- The League welcomed the Western Rams Football Netball Club as the newest Member Club who competed in the Division 2 competition.
- The WFNL Netball competition had grown by 30% this season with a record totalling 59 teams competing across 7 Divisions in 2024 (up from 44 teams in 2023). Around half of our Member Clubs now have an established netball program.
- Senior football has grown 9.5% in 2024 with 86 teams competing (up from 78 teams in 2023).
- Junior football achieved a 10.3% growth in 2024 with 224 teams (183 Boys/mixed and 41 Girls teams) entered for season 2024. This is the greatest number of Junior teams (from Under 8's to Under 16's) we have had over the past five years and represents a 5% growth in Junior football from pre-covid numbers in 2019.



- Junior Girls football competitions had grown by an astounding 60% following the implementation of the two-year age groups for season 2024 (formerly three-year age groups in 2023). We now have the highest number of Junior Girls 41 teams participating in our League (the previous record was 28 teams in 2019) with seventeen out of 34 of our WFNL Member Clubs now competing with a Junior Girls program. This is a great foundation for us to continue to build for the future.
- Significant investment has been made into Umpiring across all grades and disciplines of football and netball to build the base for the future of our competitions.
- The League introduced for the first time a Thirds football competition in 2024 that was predominantly played on a Friday night and provided the opportunity for twelve-teams to participate and play Finals.
- The League continues to invest resources into education, engagement and consultation by delivering the Club Conference, President's Dinner and the inaugural Women's Football Forum.
- The League delivered a 39% rise in our commercial revenue this year through innovative partnerships which will ensure we continue to minimise the servicing costs to Clubs and keep participation in the west as affordable as possible.

FINALS SERIES

We finished our year strong with an amazing Finals Series which included a return to the recently redeveloped Skinner Reserve for the Division 1, Women's, Thirds and Junior Final Series.

We also enjoyed our biggest crowd in recent times at Chirnside Park with over 4,500 spectators walking through the gates to watch the Division 1 Grand Final between Werribee Districts and Hoppers Crossing.

Well done to John Semertzidis, Jared Polec and the Hoppers Crossing Football Club, for overturning what was the wooden spoon in 2023 to winning the ultimate prize in 2024, the Division 1 Premiership.

The Senior Final Series was once again incredibly competitive. Nine different Clubs out of the 16 Senior Grand Finals won either a Football or Netball Premiership.

What is truly remarkable is the average winning margins of the Senior Men's and Women's Football Grand Finals.

For the four Grand Finals, the average winning margin was less than 3 points (2.75) – or only one kick in it. And the combined winning margin for all four Premierships was a total of 11 points. To say it was close would be an understatement and a great showcase of western football.

Furthermore, as a test to the strength of football in our region, League partner and western stakeholder the Werribee Football Club achieved the pinnacle of success claiming the 2024 VFL Premiership against Southport.

And the North Melbourne Football Club, who also operate across the Wyndham area, defeated the Western Bulldogs to claim the VFLW Premiership. Well done to all western region-based Clubs on your respective success.

OUR PEOPLE

None of this would be possible without the dedication and support of our many champions, and I want to extend my sincerest appreciation to all who have contributed to our success this year and in previous years that has led to season 2024.

Every week the League delivers 177 matches across all grades of football and netball which equates to over 2,700 Home and Away matches and a further 190 Finals Series matches. This is supported by over 1,500 registered volunteers and approximately two-hundred thousand volunteer hours across the League to successfully deliver a season. It is without a doubt an enormous operation.

To our Member Clubs, volunteers, Umpires, coaches, partners and wider community - your commitment is the foundation upon which the WFNL stands and your sustained tireless efforts week-in and week-out ensures each year is a continued success.

To Meredith and the WFNL Board, thank you for your ongoing support and encouragement of the Team, who were completely new and had a very short run up leading into this season.

To the WFNL team, Luke Henry, Dom Lammardo, Steve Keating, Kerrie Courts, Justin Jenvey, Jordan Dalliston and Kelly Jones - we are a small team doing big things. Thank you for all your hard work, passion and commitment to delivering an amazing year of football and netball season. Your determination and at times perseverance to make a difference is truly appreciated and serves as motivation to me - you should all be proud of what you have achieved.

As we look ahead to the next season, I am confident that we will continue to achieve great things together.

LUKE HENRY

This year we saw a significant change in Senior Men's & Women's Football with a decrease in Divisions. We saw Division 2 & 3 combined for the Senior Men's competition, and the Senior Women's competition we saw only one division.

The League welcomed in Western Rams from the Riddell District Football Netball League for their first year in the WFNL. The League was also very proud to have our Senior Women's & Under 18 Women's competitions have standalone finals which was a great way to showcase our Women's Football in the West.

DIVISION 1

Division 1 we saw a nine team men's competition with all eight teams from 2023 competition and we saw 2023 Division 2 Premiers, Parkside come up into the top division. In division 1 we saw an extremely competitive and even competition across the board.

The Average winning margin being 31 points over the whole season. 48 matches in Division one was under a 5-goal margin, including 22 games under 10 points and 6 draws.

Congratulations to Hoppers Crossing who finished in fifth position who claimed a one-point victory over Werribee Districts in the TIV Division 1 Grand Final.

DIVISION 2

The League welcomed in Western Rams into the competition after their move from the RDFNL. Rams managed to secure their first Senior Football win in more than five years, which was a great achievement for the club.

The League saw mixed results in Division 2 with a clear gap between the top couple of sides to the rest of the competition. This created some big margins in this competition. To the credit of all teams in the competition every match was played out in right spirits. Albion went through the season undefeated.

The finals series saw a top 6 and it was highly anticipated that Albion & Sunshine would meet in the Grand Final. This proved to be the case, with the two meeting in the Grand Final where it was Sunshine who proved the stronger side on the day to be Division 2 premiers.

Congratulations to them, as they embark on their journey into Division 1 for 2025, where Albion & Newport will also join them in the topflight competition.

SENIOR WOMEN'S

In 2024 our Senior Women's competition was fielded with nine teams, which was five down from the previous year. With nine teams, the League proceeded with a one division competition for the 16-round season.



It was fantastic to see the evenness in the competition, with only three games separating the top 5 teams.

The top two teams in Werribee Centrals and Caroline Springs faced off in a class grand final in which Werribee Centrals kicked the last three goals in the game to clinch a two-point victory in the St Vincent's Private Hospital Werribee Senior Women's, Grand Final.

Congratulations to Werribee Centrals on winning their first Senior Women's premiership.

UNDER 18 MEN'S / UNDER 18 WOMEN'S

In 2024 our Senior Women's competition was fielded with nine teams, which was five down from the previous year. With nine teams, the League proceeded with a one division competition for the 16-round season.



UNDER 18 MEN'S / UNDER 18 WOMEN'S CONTINUED

Our 18 Women's competition saw a low number of teams in the competition this year, however it didn't weaken the strength of the competition. Congratulations to Caroline Springs on their premiership in the Under 18 Women's.

The League is looking to continue to improve these competitions as we hope for a good pathway and transition for these players into Senior Football in the WFNL or at a higher level.

THIRDS

In 2024, the WFNL introduced a Thirds competition for the first time. The Thirds competition was a great success with twelve clubs entering teams into the competition, which saw majority of games played on a Friday night which provided great flexibility for players and also for clubs to have Friday night home games. Congratulations to Yarraville Seddon Eagles for claiming the Thirds premiership in a thrilling game against Sunshine at Skinner Reserve.

The League was wrapped to host our Senior Finals at some premium venues in which was a great way to showcase our Senior Football Finals and provided a great experience for all participants and spectators who attended these finals. Our Senior Finals venues included:

2024 was a successful year for the WFNL, with over 220 Junior Teams competing across 31 Junior Competitions and 8 Junior Interleague teams representing the league.

It takes a lot of time, effort, and passion to deliver the 1582 junior matches played this season. I want to acknowledge all match day officials, volunteers, parents and spectators from all 27 Junior Clubs who have contributed positively to our Season 2024.

It was great to go out to different clubs each Sunday and meet so many volunteers who ensure junior football happens every weekend.

TEAM NUMBERS

Total Junior Team Numbers increased from 202 teams in 2023 to 224 teams in 2024. Team Numbers not only reached what they were pre-COVID but surpassed it. Early records indicate further growth in 2025.

GIRLS FOOTBALL

At the end of 2023, after receiving considerable feedback from workshops and the competition review structure about the 2023 Girls Age Groups, the league surveyed clubs.

The survey found that most of our clubs believed that the double age group structure would better serve the interests and requirements of their members in comparison to the previous Under 10, 12, 15 and 18 Girls structure. The decision was then made to revert to the double age group model (Under 10, 12, 14, 16 and 18 Girls structure).

This decision ultimately led to an increase of 19 Junior Girls teams and a 25% increase in Junior Girls aged 16 years and younger registered compared to 2023. For the first time in league history, the Under 12 and 14 Girls competitions had two divisions, allowing teams to play more competitive games against similarly skilled opponents.

In 2024, we also introduced the Junior Girls Developmental Player Policy, this policy intended to enable junior girls who were new to football (either never played or very early in their football journey) to start/continue playing football with an exemption to play in an age group a year below.



Twenty-five girls received an exemption under the policy, and we look forward to continuing to remove some participation barriers that stop Junior Girls from playing Football.

There were plenty of success stories in 2024 that could be compiled into a novel, some of these successes include:

- Albion winning the Under 12 Division 2 Girls premiership, in 2023, the team didn't win a single game and averaged a 70-point loss each week. They were also a mainstay in Under 10 Girls in 2022 & 2023 when we only had 2 and 3 teams respectively.
- Aintree fielding a Junior Girls team for the first time in their short history, with an Under 10s Girls team.
- Laverton & Truganina Thunder combined to enter an Under 12 Girls team, Truganina Thunder's first girls' team since 2019 in the inaugural Under 10 Girls competition and Laverton's first every junior girls team.
- Newport Power having only 4 Under 10 Girls registered a week before the season, managing to get a side up for Round 1, and then having to introduce a second Under 10 Girls side in Round 5 after exceeding 20 registrations.
- St Bernards, Werribee Districts and Wyndhamvale entering in Junior Girls teams for the first time since pre-COVID

As we move to 2025, we look forward to maintaining the stability created in Junior Girls Football and supporting the continued growth.

GRADING

After receiving feedback from clubs that grading was not working as well as it could be, our league made slight changes to its grading policy where it was able to make grading changes from Round 2 up until Round 6 in 2024.

This allowed some extra flexibility, and average margins did go down from Round 7 onwards, but there are still improvements to be made.

In 2025, the league will align with other metro junior football leagues and begin the season with four grading rounds, then teams will be moved into divisions after Round 4.

Our Under 13 Boys 2nd team once again went undefeated for the 3rd year in a row, whilst our Under 13 Boys 1st team and Under 13 Girls team both picked up a win over their two matches.

The league strengthened their relationship with AFL Victoria, particularly in the Participation space, which saw the Auskick to Junior football transition grow through the Unders program. It was fantastic to enter a new era in 2024 as the newly named Western Football Netball League. The addition of Netball in the League's title reflects the substantial work accomplished in previous seasons and acknowledges of the significances of Netball in the League. Dom Lammardo worked diligently in 2023 to advocate for netball, setting the stage for growth as I stepped into this role in early April 2024. It is also great see the role of Netball Operations Coordinator transition from what was previously a combined position of Football and Netball Operations.

Early in the season, we expanded the competition to include a 7th Division, welcoming more clubs to the netball fold. We transitioned from Game Day to Netball Connect, with dedicated support from Netball Victoria. This shift introduced live scoring, enhancing the experience for participants, and we implemented rolling substitutions, allowing each team to field up to 12 players. These changes have helped our clubs flourish and include more numbers on Fridays.

REGULAR SEASON RECAP

As we approached Round 1, it was exciting to see the inclusion of both new and returning teams. We welcomed back Wyndhamvale, who last competed in 2022. Glen Orden made a remarkable leap, expanding from two teams to six in just one offseason, including the addition of Division One side for the first time. West Footscray and Parkside joined the league with enthusiasm as inaugural teams and quickly displayed their competitiveness. Both clubs are expected to expand with three teams in 2025.

This season also featured the inclusion of numerous VNL players competing across Divisions 1 and 2, elevating the strength of our competition. The Division 1 Grand Final ended with a thrilling 2-goal difference, while Division 2 was decided by just 1 goal win with 3 seconds to go. We celebrated a remarkable increase in participation, with 1,067 participants registered this season—an incredible jump from last season's 500.

This success is due to the tireless efforts of our club coordinators, volunteers, coaches, players and talented umpires, all of whom have helped us shape a new future within the WFNL. A mention to Bianca Findlay on her role as Netball Umpire Coordinator throughout the season, we thank her for her time and participation and wish her well on her next adventure.

In 2023, we had 44 teams competing, and in just six months, that number grew to 59. While this growth is fantastic, it has also raised concerns about the availability of court space and facilities. To address this WFNL CEO David Jennings has worked diligently within the community advocating for the netball to hopefully secure a future facility for the WFNL. Although the proposed facility is a few years away.



in the meantime we're excited to announce that we've secured the State Hockey and Netball Centre at Parkville, and Eagle stadium in werribee This, along with our home at Whitten Oval, will enable us to facilitate our 2025 competition across possibly 13 courts, up from 7 in 2024. This change will accommodate our anticipated growth, allowing us to support our clubs with participation increase for the next 2 years.

GRAND FINALS RECAP

In Division 1, we witnessed an unexpected triumph as Glen Orden claimed the premiership cup for the first time in their history, with a new head coach and a revamped structure, they secured premiership cups in five of the six Grand Finals they contested—an extraordinary achievement. Their dominance was evident early on with both their Division 1 and 2 teams undefeated at the top of the ladder for 11 consecutive weeks.

As a league we introduced Grand Final medals for our esteemed umpires, acknowledging their hard work and commitment throughout the season. This new recognition shows our dedication to valuing the umpiring space at every level.

We continued with our purpose which was to strive to be the benchmark community umpiring group in Australia, providing outstanding service to the WFNL and clubs, along with providing clear development pathways for all umpires in a professional, welcoming, inclusive and diverse environment utilising first class facilities for all members.

The league rebranded and obtained a new apparel sponsor. This involved kitting out 220 umpires with new uniforms.

The umpiring academies provide some outstanding talent. The league aims to continue to invest, retain and grow umpiring and coaching at all levels to ensure that participants are supported, and games are managed to a high standard.

We debuted a number of young umpires in U18s, Reserves and Senior football, with the view to expanding our senior umpiring group and it's depth of talent for the 2025 season where the Division One fixture will comprise an extra two matches.

We established our Women & Girls' Umpiring Academy and became a signatory to the Women and Girls Community Football Charter.

The WFNL continued to deliver high-quality media content across all of its online platforms in 2024. After a period without a dedicated Media and Communications Manager the previous year I was thrilled to be appointed to the role ahead of the 2024 season and was pleased to bring some stability to the position.

I would like to make mention of the efforts of several WFNL team members including current Junior Football Manager Dom Lammardo who juggled their own work with that of media responsibilities following the departure of longtime Media and Communications Manager Kristen Alebakis in the early part of 2023.

With a strong platform built by those previously in the role as well as the league having a reputation for producing some of the best community sports league content, I didn't want to change things up to drastically.

As such, a lot of the content remained similar to past years with only some slight tweaks mainly around the league's rebranding to Western Football Netball League while I also tried to add my own spin on things. The season was also a chance to learn what content is best received and to identify what changes can be made and opportunities for new content moving forward.

SOCIAL MEDIA & WRITTEN CONTENT

Content once again included weekly match reports, image galleries and a wide variety of social media graphics from ladders, fixtures and teams of the week as well as video highlights and Heartland Award winners.

A lot of the content generated was possible due to our ongoing partnership with Premier Data who provided team and individual players statistics for every match of the TIV Division 1 season. Having access to these stats allows us to highlight the top performers across the top grade of the competition as well as assist with picking the Player of the Week and Team of the Week.

In terms of written content, I would like to give a big shout out to our two volunteer writers Connor Pain and Kel Rowe who produced the majority of the TIV Division 1 and St Vincent's Private Hospital Werribee Senior Women's match reports yet again this season. Without their contributions we wouldn't be able to provide a recap of all three senior football grades each week.

To touch on some of our best performing content on our social media, among the top posts were those that recognised the achievements of former and current WFNL players. These included posts on Brisbane Lions rookie Logan Morris who made his AFL debut this year and was a member of the Lions' premiership winning team. Other top content acknowledged current Suns Senior Women's captain Mary Daw on winning the VFLW premiership with North Melbourne and Saad El-Hawli being picked by Essendon in the AFL Mid-Season Rookie Draft.



Another success was our social media Grand Final coverage which was again the most comprehensive of any metropolitan league. For the Division 1 Grand Finals we had 60 total posts across the day with our story posts attracting a combined 185,000 views on Instagram alone. A video of the Hoppers Crossing bench showing coaches and players at the final siren celebrating their TIV Division 1 premiership triumph was the highest viewed video of the year with 165,000 plays across Instagram and Facebook..

CAPTURING & CALLING THE ACTION

We again teamed up with Sportscast Australia to have every game of the TIV Division 1 season filmed while WynFm continued to broadcast one senior men's football match every Saturday.

Having Sportscast capture the action in our top grade only enhances our content offering giving supporters highlights of all four games every week while also being a resource for clubs to review and plan for upcoming games. I was fortunate enough to step into commentary caravan on several occasions this year and can honestly say that our weekly match broadcast is as good as any you'll hear across community sport. Each member of the team has extensive knowledge of the league and is duly prepared for every game which makes for a brilliant listen. We look forward to the boys returning to the air next year and even utilising them further as we look to reintroduce a WFNL podcast in 2025.

LOCAL LEGENDS PHOTOGRAPHY

The league would not produce anywhere near the amount of content it does without the efforts of Darrell Jones of Local Legends Photography whose passion and dedication to not only the WFNL but the majority of clubs across the league is almost unmatched.

Darrell's work begins even before the first bounce or first pass of the season is made, taking thousands of photos at the league's annual Media Day event which results in a huge amount of content that is used in the lead up to and throughout the season.

On that note, thank you to the Truganina Thunder Football Club who hosted the 2024 Media Day on a very hot Labour Day Long Weekend.

During the season Darrell attended multiple venues every weekend almost always shooting two senior football matches on a Saturday but sometimes three and even four. 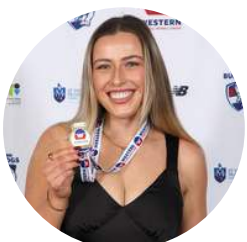
