

It is my pleasure to present the 2025 Annual Report for the Western Football Netball League (WFNL). This year has been another excellent year for football and netball in Melbourne's west, reflecting our community's passion and the League's sustained growth and impact.

CELEBRATING FOOTBALL & NETBALL IN THE WEST

In 2025, the League continued to grow participation across the junior and senior competitions in Football and our Senior Netball competition continued its strong growth.

Football Highlights

- Junior Football participation grew by 4.5%, with Junior Girls increasing by 11.5% — now fielding 46 teams, up from 41 last year.
- Senior Football expanded to 92 teams across eight grades — a 7% increase from 2024.
- Thirds Competition continues to thrive under Friday night lights, energising crowds and setting the tone for the weekend.
- Umpiring is a vital aspect of the game. This year 434
 umpires were officiating weekly a 4% overall increase.
 Female umpire representation rose by 20%, now
 totalling 60 women and girls in our officiating ranks.

Netball Highlights

- Team numbers increased by 18%, with 1,466 players competing in 68 teams across 7 divisions officiated by a strong cohort of 95 registered umpires.
- Over 50% of our Member Clubs (18 in total) now field netball teams.
- To cater for this demand, the competition games were played at three venues: Whitten Oval, Eagle Stadium in Werribee, and The State Netball Centre in Parkville.

These numbers highlight our "on court" achievements, however the true impact lies in the community bonds and social value our League fosters across Melbourne's West.

Well over 300,000 volunteer hours were contributed this season to make these competitions possible, underscoring the integral role of sport in building community connection and cohesion.



GOVERNING THE LEAGUE

The WFNL is governed with a commitment to effective, independent oversight to ensure our League serves the interests of all participating clubs and stakeholders. Decisions are made with a focus on financial sustainability, strategic alignment, legal compliance, and risk management.

Our CEO oversees daily operations and is accountable to the WFNL Board, which meets regularly and provides expert support through the diverse skills and experience of its members. I extend my sincere gratitude to my fellow Board members, who generously volunteer their time to guide our League with integrity and dedication.

At this year's AGM we will farewell a long-standing Board member, Ross Williamson. Ross has been on the Board since 2013 and has been Vice President since 2023. During this time, Ross has supported many initiatives working with our CEOs and team. On behalf of the WFNL Board , I thank Ross for his outstanding service and contribution to the strengthening of the League.

DELIVERING ON OUR STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

In 2025, the Western Football Netball League (WFNL) continued its strategic journey with clarity and purpose. As we advanced through the second year of our 2024–2026 Strategic Plan, the League strengthened its foundations, developed new opportunities, and reaffirmed its commitment to the communities we serve.

This year has been defined by steady progress, considered decision-making, and collective effort - each milestone contributing to the unfolding story of our League's growth and sustainability.

OUR CLUBS

Our Member Clubs remain central to everything we do. Through ongoing consultation and engagement, we deepened our understanding of Club needs and aligned League resources to meet them.

This year, we invested in the Club Development Lead role, enhancing dedicated support for Member Clubs and driving initiatives to strengthen operations, governance and long-term sustainability.

Milestones & Success

- Invested in the Club Development Lead resource to provide greater support to Member Clubs and development initiatives.
- Strengthened Club support through expanded development resources and tailored advisory sessions including the second running of the Club Development Conference.
- Improved alignment between League operations and Club needs through increased communication channels and workshops.
- 65-point Club Health Survey that provided invaluable information for future support.
- Rolled out updated By-Laws and new Competition Regulations to reinforce operational consistency and support Club decision-making.
- Facilitated strategic planning assistance for Clubs to support long-term growth and sustainability.
- Introduction of a Concussion Management program in partnership with Concussion Central which will be strengthened for season 2026.



PARTICIPATION

Participation remained a powerful indicator of our League's health and impact. Team numbers increased, competitive balance strengthened, and investment in Umpire development contributed to competition standards and experience.

Our competitions continue to evolve, ensuring they remain accessible, inclusive, and aligned with community expectations.

This growth is more than numerical - it signifies enhanced opportunity, improved experience, and strengthened pathways.

Milestones & Success

- Return of Senior Interleague with strong football and netball performances against the Southern Football Netball League (SFNL).
- Overall participation growth of 12%, including Senior football (+1.6%), Junior football (+10.7%), female football (+10.6%), and Netball (+45.7%).
- Total teams increased 6.8% to 394.
- Football umpire numbers up 27% (529 total), including 20% growth in female umpires (60). Netball umpires increased 137.5% to 95.
- Expanded female participation programs and entrylevel offerings.
- Strengthened talent pathways through development programs and collaboration with AFL Victoria and Netball Victoria.
- Initiatives delivered to retain and support umpires, coaches, and volunteers.
- Enhanced competitive balance and continued investment in officiating and competition standards.
- Stable and growing competition structure supporting participation pathways and club sustainability.

COMMUNITY

FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP

The WFNL is committed to delivering value for Member Clubs through strong commercial offerings and sound financial management. In 2025, financial sustainability continued to guide our strategic direction, with diverse revenue streams enabling investment in growth, community programs, and operational excellence.

New and strengthened partnerships increased financial capacity and community impact, demonstrating a League that manages today while planning for the future. Despite ongoing Finals Series challenges, sponsorship revenue grew 13%, supported by live streaming, radio broadcasts, the WFNL TV show, and the League podcast.

LUKE HENRY

In 2025 there were plenty of positives through our senior football competitions, we saw a restructure of our Senior Men's competitions which saw an exciting opportunity for three clubs to go into the topflight. Our Senior Women's competition again comprised of one division, in which we had a standalone finals series to showcase our Senior Women's football. Our Thirds Friday night competition continued to grow for the second-year running.

The League proudly brought back Senior Interleague for the first time since 2019, and with it the first Senior Women's Football Interleague team in the WFNL's history.

DIVISION 1

Following the 2024 Season the League made major changes to both Senior Men's Divisions. Albion, Newport and Sunshine were all promoted into Division 1 for the 2025 and 2026 Seasons following a competition restructure This provided an opportunity for all three clubs to come into the topflight of the WFNL.

This then meant the 2025 season became a twelve-team competition over eighteen rounds. All three promoted clubs were extremely competitive, with Albion winning 8 games, Newport 6 games and Sunshine 2 games.

Werribee Districts once again in 2025 proved themselves to be the team to beat throughout the season, but had a number of good challengers in Caroline Springs, Yarraville Seddon and reining premiers Hoppers Crossing. The Finals series consisted of those four listed teams plus Spotswood.

The League was lucky enough to host our full Division 1 Finals series at Avalon Airport Oval, Werribee. The finals series was enthralling with Werribee Districts and Caroline Springs making the Grand Final. This was a fantastic game to showcase our premier division of football with the match going into extra-time to decide the premier.





Having proving they were the team to beat throughout the season Werribee Districts clinched the premiership with a thrilling 12-point victory. The competition will remain a 12-team competition in 2026, and we look forward to many more competitive matches.

DIVISION 2

With the re-structure of Division 1 & 2, it saw Albion, Newport and Sunshine all leave Division 2 to go into the top flight. North Sunshine didn't field a Senior or Reserve team within Division 2 in 2025, therefore creating a 10-team competition. With the top three teams from 2024 going into Division 1, it certainly was a benefit to the competitiveness and evenness of the Division 2 competition.

With the re-structure we saw a 31-point average margin difference between the two seasons. It also saw several clubs compete in finals for the first time within the Division 2 competition.

The two top teams throughout the Season, provided an entertaining finals series with North Footscray defeating Wyndhamvale by 3 points in the second semi-final, with Wyndhamvale proving to strong in the Grand Final, defeating North Footscray comfortably in the end. Similar to Division 1, the Division 2 competition will remain the same in 2026.

WOMEN'S FOOTBALL

For our Senior Women's competition, we had nine teams entered comprising of one division. Whilst there was a gap between the top teams and bottom teams, the competition certainly provided plenty of competitive matches, with three draws during the home and away season. The finals series we also saw extremely competitive finals series, with over half of the games finishing within a couple of goals margin.

The League this year had a stand-alone Senior Women's grand final held at Donald McLean Reserve, Spotswood. It was a fantastic turnout which included several sponsor activations to promote our Senior Women's competition. This was a great way for us to showcase our Senior Women's division.

The game lived up to the hype with Caroline Springs going through undefeated all season to win the premiership in a close game against Yarraville Seddon who competed in their first Senior Women's grand final in the club's history.

With low team numbers entered for the Under 18 Women's competition, the League worked with the EDFL who accommodated these teams to play within the EDFL Under 18 Women's competitions. Caroline Springs competed in the Premier competition with Point Cook Centrals and Spotswood/Altona Juniors in Division 1.

All three teams had outstanding seasons in their respective divisions, with Caroline Springs winning the Premier competition and Point Cook Centrals coming runners up within Division 1.

Caroline Springs and Yarraville Seddon also entered reserves teams in the EDFL competition.



UNDER 18S

In 2025 we saw a total of 19 Under 18s teams with two strong divisions, that saw six clubs field teams within both divisions. We saw four extra teams from the previous season which was great to see the growth within this age bracket. It was also fantastic to see a number of players within this competition represent the Western Jets, as we continue to see Under 18 talent being showcased at Talent League level and the national stage.

Both competitions were extremely competitive and provided an opportunity for players at different skill levels to enhance their football and play with their mates.

This was also enhanced by the League introducing an Under 18's over-age policy to allow players within a sixmonth age bracket apply to play within the competition. We saw 20 players play in the competition under this permit, which was a great benefit to these players and the clubs to assist with their playing numbers. We want to keep players engaged at this age level and the League was proud to provide this opportunity to those players.

The Under 18 Finals series was extremely competitive as we saw both undefeated teams Newport (Division 1) and West Footscray (Division 2) reach premiership success.

THIRDS

We saw our Thirds competition grow for the second season the League has run this competition. In 2025 we had 13 teams entered in the competition, as we welcomed in North Footscray, North Sunshine, Hoppers Crossing, Laverton Magpies and Werribee Centrals Sporting Club from the Geelong & District Football Netball League into the competition.

The Thirds competition again provided players an opportunity to play on the Friday night as this competition continues to grow.

In an exciting finals series, we saw Sunshine defeat Yarraville Seddon in a rematch of last year's grand final. We look forward to continuing the Thirds competition in 2026, with great expressions of interest already from a number of new clubs looking to enter a team into the competition.

FINALS

The League was wrapped to host our Senior Finals at some premium venues in what was a great way to showcase our Senior Football Finals and provided a great experience for all participants and spectators who attended these finals. Our Senior Finals venues included:

- Avalon Airport Oval (Division 1 Finals)
- Yarraville Oval (Division 2 Finals)
- Donald McLean Reserve (Senior Women's)
- Laverton Park (Thirds)

Thank you to the host clubs in Werribee Football Club, Yarraville Seddon, Spotswood and Laverton for your efforts and for providing a great finals series for all involved.

SENIOR INTERLEAGUE

The League was extremely excited to bring back Senior Interleague for the first time since 2019.

It was also the first time the League has had a Senior Women's Interleague team which was a proud moment for the League and a great opportunity for the women selected to represent the League they play in.

TThe WFNL hosted the Southern Football Netball League (SFNL) another major metro competition in Under 19's, Women's, Men's Football and Senior Netball included too.

The program started back in late 2024, with the appointment of all head coaches. The three football programs were led by experienced coaches in Chris Muratore (Men's), Alex O'Shea (Women's) & Kirk Heberle (Under 19's) who were outstanding in setting up and leading these programs. Clubs were able to nominate players who were then invited into the program for trailing training sessions. All sessions were held over several weeks with the squads being finalised in the week leading up to the matches.

All squads were kited out with new WFNL Interleague apparel and were presented their jumpers at a team dinner on the Thursday night, which was a great way for all four programs to come together to celebrate and look forward to the upcoming weekend.

All football games were held and hosted by Werribee Football Club at Melbourne Avalon Airport Oval. It was an extremely rewarding day for all programs, and a great recognition to all players, coaches and support staff who were involved in all programs.

The WFNL would like to thank all players, coaches and support staff for their tireless efforts and work to create these unforgettable moments for everyone involved.

GIRLS FOOTBALL

Girls' Football continues to grow steadily with the introduction of double-age groups in the second year.

For the first time, the U12, U14 and U16 age groups each had more than 10 teams. 16 clubs fielded Junior Girls teams in 2025.





West Footscray, a mainstay in the WFNL Senior Women's competition, introduced an Under 12 Girls team in 2025, their first Junior Girls team since 2019.

Rules were also made consistent across age groups, meaning the Girls' rules were the same as Mixed/Boys in their relevant age group. This was an important step, along with equal umpire pay rates, which meant more umpires and a better quality of umpires compared to previous years.

GRADING

In 2025, we aligned with other metro junior football leagues and began the season with four grading rounds. Teams were then be moved into divisions after Round 4.

This allowed some flexibility for the league to see how teams would match up against each other.

As always, grading is a difficult science and relies on clubs grading their teams correctly and honestly, and teams playing to their full potential.

JUNIOR INTERLEAGUE

It was another successful year for our Junior Interleague Program in 2025.

Our Under 15 cohort won a total of 8 out of 9 games to finish their Junior Interleague experience. Special mention must be made to coach Daniel Neville and the 2010-born cohort, who hadn't lost a game in Division 1 in three years.

A lot of talent is coming through our ranks, while our Under 16 Girls had some strong results in Division 2, which will launch our future teams to challenge themselves in Division 1.

We were pleased to introduce an Under 14 Girls team in 2025, which complemented the existing two Under 14 Boys teams.

Our Under 14 Girls fought extremely hard against very tough opposition in Division 1 and leagues that are ahead of us in Junior Girls development. We will continue to challenge ourselves in Division 1 and aim narrow the gap each year.

A highlight of our carnival was the first-ever double header for Under 14 & 15 Girls, which included a breakfast for our Under 13 Girls, and an AFL Victoria Auskick & Superkick activation during the two games, which saw over 40 female participants aged 5 to 12 years old participate.

Thank you to Newport Power for hosting, AFL Victoria for running the programs, and NFNL for accommodating us.

We would have been able to play those games without Spotswood and Newport Power hosting, as well as training sessions being hosted by Altona Juniors, Point Cook Centrals, Truganina and Western Jets.

Finishing our Interleague program was our Under 13 Girls and Under 13 Boys Div 1 & Div 2 sides. Playing at Crofts Reserve on all three ovals, it was an amazing day and experience to have 3 footy games on over 3 time slots.



Over 650 people came together to celebrate the Junior Football season, the best and fairest winners and the efforts of coaches and volunteers at our Junior Presentation Night.

Congratulations to Eran Jansz (Junior Coach), Tim Johnstone (Youth Coach), Chris Tomazos (Up & Coming Coach), Cameron Tout (Junior Club Official) and Aintree (Junior Club) who were celebrated on the night, as well as all the premiership & best and fairest winners.

NEW INITIATIVES

2025 allowed the league to grow and improve several new initiatives it introduced in 2024.

The Under 8s and 9s Round Robin and the Under 10s Lightning Carnival became part of the end of home and away season fixture, with over 1000 WFNL Junior Footballers participating.

The league's relationship with AFL Victoria, particularly in the participation space, is as strong as ever, as we continue to work on important projects such as the Auskick to Junior football transition through the Unders program.

Over 450 Auskickers took part in the Unders program in 2025. Well done to Josh Coward and Marlon Carub for the power of work they do in our region in this space.

The league continues to work with AFL Clubs Western Bulldogs, North Melbourne and Essendon to ensure our WFNL players eligible for Next Generation Academies are being captured.

The Western Bulldogs launched the Futures Academy in consultation with Western Jets, which provided a great opportunity for our U13 and U14 Interleague participants to focus on Skill Development, Athletic Development and Athlete Education before they enter the Western Jets Under 16 Pathway.



TALENT PATHWAYS

Our league celebrated two AFLW draftees last December, with Seirra Grieves (Pick 11 – Richmond) and Lou-Lou Field (Pick 46 – Carlton) being drafted in the 2024 AFL Women's Draft.

Sierra played 103 WFNL Games, including 2 Junior Interleague games, representing Yarraville Seddon. She would play 9 games for Richmond in her debut season.

Lou-Lou played 108 WFNL games, including 2 Junior Interleague games, mainly representing Werribee Districts. She would go on to play her debut in Round 6 for Carlton in a strong outing.

In November, we celebrated Finnegan Davis (Pick 51 – GWS Giants) being drafted in the 2025 AFL Draft. Finn played 63 WFNL games, including 4 Junior Interleague games, representing Williamstown Juniors. We wish him the best of luck ahead of his first season.

Tom Burton (Point Cook) and Oskar Ainsworth (Williamstown Juniors) have been invited to Richmond and St Kilda, respectively, to trial for a list spot with those clubs. We wish both boys the best of luck and hope to see another couple of WFNL players on AFL lists come 2026.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2026

2026 is looking to be another year of participation growth. We will continue to work with all clubs and continue to consolidate the positive direction.

We will also look to restructure the Junior Board with some more formalities and structures around it.

LACHLAN HARTY

The 2025 season marked my first year as Director of Umpiring at the Western Football Netball League, and it was a season of growth, learning, and genuine progress. I'm proud of what our umpiring group has achieved and excited about the direction we're heading.

GROWTH & PARTICPATION

We continued to build on our purpose — to be the benchmark community umpiring group in Australia. Our focus remained on delivering outstanding service to the WFNL and clubs, while fostering a professional, inclusive, and development-focused environment for all umpires.

This year saw a 9.5% increase in registered umpires, rising to 460, including 60 female umpires — a 17.6% increase from 2024. This growth reflects our commitment to recruitment, retention, and creating pathways for all.

We filled 460 additional field umpire appointments in junior football, equivalent to 230 extra games — a testament to the strength of our Academies, as well as the hard work by our Junior Field Coach, Julian Ensink.

Community Umpiring Round was a big success for our group, with a massive attendance at Hanmer Reserve, where training was held by AFL Umpires Matt Stevic, Anthony Laughton and Josh Mather, as well as a large contingent of VFL listed umpires.

'Razor' Ray Chamberlain suited up in WFNL colours to umpire a TIV Division 1 Senior Men's match at Spotswood earlier in the season, which provided positive exposure for the league.

DEVELOPMENT & INNOVATION

We introduced the program HUDL for match vision and Sportsgauge for structured feedback, enhancing our coaching and development processes. These tools have helped us deliver more targeted feedback and support to umpires across all levels.

The average age of the field umpires in our Senior (under 18s - seniors) grand final panels dropped from 31.7 to 26.6, highlighting the exciting young talent coming through our ranks.

We also had 2 field umpires, 3 boundary umpires, and 2 goal umpires represent the WFNL in the Coates Talent League and V/Line Cup, showcasing our development pathways in action.

FEMALE UMPIRING MILESTONES

A historic moment saw our first-ever female field umpire officiate a Division 1 Senior Men's match — with all boundary and goal umpires in that game also female. This milestone reflects the depth of talent among our women umpires and our commitment to gender equity.



WFNL umpires were strongly represented at AFL-run Women & Girls Hubs, and our Women & Girls Umpiring Satellite programs saw some good registration numbers.

Throughout the year we made the conscious decision to provide the Senior Women's competition with Division 1 men's quality field umpires which was met with a positive response from clubs and something we will look at continuing into 2026.

ACADEMIES & TRAINING

Our umpiring academies at Werribee, Point Cook, and Hoppers Crossing continued to produce outstanding talent, as highlighted by the increase in junior appointments filled.

Senior training was held regularly at Hanmer Reserve, with strong attendance and engagement across all levels. We were lucky enough to have regular, almost weekly, visits from VFL and State League listed umpires to assist with training.

We also welcomed new coaches and mentors into the fold, strengthening our support network and ensuring umpires had access to guidance and feedback throughout the season.

REPRESENTATIVE & VFL ACHIEVEMENTS

We also celebrated former WFNL Boundary Umpire, Anthony Laughton's AFL debut, and acknowledged the achievements of former WFNL Umpires now officiating finals at VFL level.

GRAND FINAL RECOGNITION

The 2025 Finals Series was once again thrilling, with many games decided by narrow margins. We congratulate all umpires who officiated finals and grand finals — your professionalism and composure under pressure were outstanding.

JORDAN DALLISTON

Heading into 2025 I was of high spirits after locking in a deal to have our program expand into the State Netball Centre at Parkville and shortly after we also signed an agreement with Eagle Stadium, Werribee to simulate a home and away season for our Wyndham based clubs.

This allowed these clubs to attract more players that wished to play closer to home. This also saw an influx of new players into our lower divisions and helped our inaugural clubs Altona, Hobson Bay (non-affiliated), Hoppers Crossing, and Werribee Districts attract talent to their new programs within our league.

With the support from Netball Victoria our connections within the Western Suburbs grew stronger, with the new Western affiliate meetings being designed to align our vision in the West with other associations.

This connection will allow young people a place to continue playing competitive netball after they age out of Junior Netball at age 17. The new affiliate meetings have so far resulted in some great discussions about long-term growth across our strong netball community in the Western Suburbs.

Our competition in 2025 grew by 10 teams, from 58 teams in 2024 to 68 this year, a growth of 18%. Meanwhile, our umpiring space grew by a remarkable number of 280%.

This year we redefined what netball means to our participants, with the inclusion of several new programs and a new Umpire Coordinator, Woody Tangaroa, a well-respected Victorian Netball League (VNL) umpire joining our team. With the appointment of Woody we implemented a range of new strategic umpire programs to help grow each young person's knowledge on court.

This included Divisions 1-3 having League Umpires and the introduction of Club Umpires for Divisions 4-7. Our young officials were given a knowledgeable space that was heavily monitored to harness their umpiring skills.

Due to this great environment we B Badged three umpires and awarded C badges to five umpires through the 16 weeks of competition, placing us in the top 10% of Badge Certification for the state. This is all thanks to our incredible mentors and elite umpires.

SENIOR INTERLEAGUE

The WFNL Operations team orchestrated the return of Senior Interleague for the WFNL for the first time since 2019, and for the very first time this included a Senior Women's Netball side.

Facing the Southern Football Netball League was no easy feat with their program very well established and home to some of the strongest talent across Melbourne. We set out to recruit a talented bunch of coaches to represent and lead a team of brilliant netballers.



Securing Rebecca Hicks as head coach was a fantastic get with her coaching panel consisting of Sunshine coaches Mon Poliko and Rhiannon Reti as midcourt and defensive specialists respectively, and Glen Orden's Manawa Aranui as shooting specialist.

Player selection took place throughout grading phase of this year's Belgravia Apparel Netball Competition. After 5 weeks of a trials-based period, we assembled a team of 12 players with height, depth and flair to showcase the WFNL.

Come game day and it was far from ideal conditions with rainy Melbourne weather. Scores were level at hafltime, and despite trailing going into the fourth quarter, our players were hungry to take home the trophy, and they did just that finishing the game strongly to claim the silverware.

With three of the League's four football sides also winning on the day the success certainly put a pep in the step of our operations team. A career highlight and a proud moment after so many months of organising.

After a brilliant Interleague result Association Championships was next on our mind and we were hungry for more success.

ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIPS

New Netball Victoria rules resulting in VNL players not being eligible to play Association Championships, allowed us the chance to give more girls the opportunity to represent the league with 12 players and 2 training partners taking to the court at the State Netball Centre.

After the third game we were undefeated and the vibe was high heading into our match with the Hampton FNL. In a match we knew would be tough we were up by a goal with 30 seconds go before a penalty with 5 seconds left saw the game finish a draw. The result meant we needed to win our final two fixtures and rely on some other results.

Our next contest was against the strong Ovens and Murray and in another close encounter we went down in the final stages. In the end we narrowly missed out on making our first finals appearance.

Overall, it was an incredible day for our league with our players showcasing the WFNL in a strong light, with the disappointment of coming up short putting fire in our belly to go better next season.

Thank you to the players, support staff and trainers for a day of laughs and memories I'll cherish for years to come.



GRAND FINALS & SEASON RECAP

With the highlights of Representative Program behind us it was back to regular scheduling, finals were on the horizon and the space I wanted to create was going to elevate our Division 1 and 2 competitions to a new level and set the tone for the competition going forward.

Throughout the season we had many themed rounds that saw all our teams play at the State Netball Centre and after plenty of positive feedback we were able to arrange to have all of our finals played at the State Netball Centre.

The last round of the regular season proved to be a thrilling lead into finals and locked in the top four for Divisions 1 and 2 and the top five for Divisions 3 to 7. In Divisions 3 to 7, the minor premiers earnt a week off with the first round of matchups pitting positions 2v3 and 4v5 against each other.



The season culminated in two nights of Grand Finals with the Divisions 1 and 2 deciders taking place first.

Both Grand Final Fridays were huge nights for the competing clubs. Glen Orden, on the back of winning five premierships in 2024 claimed this season's Division 1 and 2 premierships and going into the final night of the season were seeking a clean sweep of all seven divisions.

The story of Night 2 was Braybrook proving the only side strong enough to deny Glen Orden a Grand Final win as they won back-to-back premierships with victory in Division 7 decider.

Glen Orden took home the remainder of our Belgravia Apparel Netball Competition trophies and medals in what was almost a perfect season for the Hawks across all divisions.

SEASON REFLECTION

The support we received from Netball Victoria this year played a pivotal role in shaping the success of our overall netball program.

Having a consistent support system and a sounding board of like-minded individuals meant I felt supported during times of stress allowing me to step up to a stronger leadership role that the league needed.

Being nominated for Association/League of the Year at the Netball Victoria Community Awards voted by our participants was the cherry on top of a fantastic season. While we didn't take home this award, the recognition for what we achieved this year was incredibly rewarding.

Our relationship with Netball Victoria continues to grow, and we're deeply grateful for their tireless work behind the scenes to help netball thrive across the state. I'm excited to see the new initiatives and ideas being initiated by our governing body and to watch more young girls and boys be introduced to netball and fall in love with the game we all cherish.

A special thank you to Metro Coordinator Lauren O'Grady, GM Stakeholder Relations Sarah Rush, and CEO Andrea Pearman for their daily efforts, compassion, and unwavering support of the WFNL.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2026

In season 2026 a new venture for the WFNL will be the inclusion of a Premier Men's Netball Division to take place alongside our Women's Competition on a Friday night at the State Netball Centre. We have already seen plenty of top-level talent, both state and national representatives, sign on at our clubs. We will also welcome St Therese Netball Club as our second non-affiliated side who will field men's next year and junior boys in season 2027.

We will also include an eighth division of netball. This sees us reach capacity division wise which will bring our divisions back to 8 teams making a more equally balanced structure.

Several clubs Western Rams, North Sunshine, Newport Power are looking to field Netball sides next year, this will be a first for Rams and Newport in the WFNL, while North Sunshine will restart their program after a few years hiatus.

Netball will see the inclusion of live scoring through iPads included this will simplify our scoring process and give our clubs some much needed support.

Overall, we had highs and lows but most of all we created some great memories. A large thank you to the WFNL team, Netball can only thrive so much and it wouldn't without such a dedicated team helping drive it. Thank you to David, Kerri, Luke, Lachlan, Justin, Kelly, Andrew and Dom.

ANDREW SHENKER

Season 2025 presented a wonderful opportunity for me to re-engage with Community Football. Starting the role in February of this year, the role provided incredible nourishment and fulfillment and some very satisfying results for the League and our member Clubs along the way. More about those "wins" shortly.

THE ROLE

To support club administrators and volunteers on key football/netball club functions, such as:

- Planning: financial, strategic, business, volunteer/club/coaching structures, position descriptions for roles, facilities and resources.
- Governance Procedures: constitutions, compliance, committee agendas/minutes, consumer affairs, conflict resolution.
- Government Relations: facilities, hire agreements, facilities planning, grants assistance, relationships
- Partnerships/Fundraising: partnership guides, ideas on fundraising options, best practice examples, AFL Victoria partnerships
- Pathways: linkage to AFL Victoria, first point of contact if clubs wish to start new teams (both junior & youth).
- Conflict Resolution/Behaviour: facilitate meetings, forums, workshops, develop values and agreed behavioural standards at committee and playing level, quidance across all conflicts.
- All other issues, concerns and dicussions that no one else covers.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS FOR 2025

The WFNL came in second in the state (1st for Metro Leagues) for fulfillment of the Club Health Check Survey with 97% of our clubs completing the survey. Thanks to all for your efforts with this. This will allow us to do some benchmarking and look at more targeted ways to assist clubs with their prioritised issues going into season 2026.

We had 18 clubs receive Telstra Football Grants of varying amounts ranging from \$1000 to over \$10,000 each for a number of different resources/projects. The total amount of dollars received across the WFNL totalled more than \$50,000, seeing us as one of the leading Leagues when aggregated across the total number of clubs per League.

Met "one on one" with in excess of 90% of clubs through the year to discuss a variety of issues that have affected those clubs including: financial stability, ongoing sustainability, development programs, conduct and behavioural concerns, volunteer recruitment and retention, new teams and coach development.

The WFNL achieved our Women and Girls Charter status early in the year, one of the first Leagues to achieve this and leading the way in this space. We now have 15 clubs Chartered as well, with another 15 having fulfilled Expressions of Interest (the paperwork that initiates the progress to Charter status) - I hope for all these clubs to be chartered by the start of Season 2026.



We conducted 9 x Coach Your Way Courses, a coach program designed specifically for Women and Girls in Football. This, again, led the state in terms of CYW courses per clubs in each League. We conducted our Womens and Girls Forum - The Way Forward, and with over 90 in attendance, there was plenty of positive feedback for us to work with in shaping the future of Women and Girls Footy in the WFNL

In conjunction with AFL Victoria, we ran a number of coach induction workshops and courses with an Elevate Course (Level 2) to come shortly. Some even delivered "financial rebates" to those clubs that provided participants. All workshops/courses have been delivered Free of Charge and we will look to continue this with AFL Victoria in 2026.

We promoted a number of AFL Victoria Partner Programs, including The Toyota Good For Footy Raffle, The Victorian Container Deposit Scheme and The TAC Rewards Program. The uptake of these programs amongst our clubs was significantly higher than past years and resulted in a number of clubs receiving additional funds across one, two or all of these programs.

We have engaged with Concussion Central, a Western Based Medical Group whose Principle, Megan Hamilton is a world renowned Concussion expert. The discussions have centred around creating a sustainable Concussion Management Program for both Senior and Junior Football and Netball and this will be implemented moving in to Season 2026.

We ran a highly successful workshop called Learning Life Through Sport, delivered by Rod Campbell, a very passionate and committed presenter in this space. The workshop centred around positive behaviours and a focus for coaches to assist in creating a positive environment for both players and parents.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2026

The League has already committed to a certified Positive Parent Program, conducted by Sport and Life Training. The League will be delivering this program online and Free of Charge to ALL PARENTS associated with our Junior Football and Netball programs and expectations will be for 100% completion rate with the support of ALL CLUBS.

We will be looking to complete a full set of Women and Girls Chartered Clubs and expectations are that all clubs will fulfill this status by end of Season 2026. Over and above this, I will shortly be calling for All Clubs to nominate someone from your club to participate in the AFL Victoria Lead Your Way Prgram - a program designed to enhance Leadership qualities for Women in Football.



Together with AFL Victoria, there will be a strong focus on financial benchmarking. This will assist us, as a League, to identify areas where we can help clubs in a number of ways - be it by reducing expenses or increasing revenue streams.

Again, in conjuction with AFL Victoria, there will be a significant importance placed on Club Governance. More specifically, we will be looking to ensure that All Clubs not only have Constitutions in place but that they are "modernised" and compliant with all government requirements.

We will be looking to schedule a number of workshops, both face to face and online, to assist clubs in the areas that they wish to be upskilled in. We will be calling for ideas and requests for this in the New Year.

We are nearing completion of an MOU with North Melbourne FC, which will assist in the areas of both club development and community programs. This will be rolled out for Season 2026.

I look forward to hearing from all of you as to any other initiatives you are looking at for the League to implement in this space

The 2025 year was a massive year in the WFNL region with an increase in junior participation where we also saw the continuation of our new programs NAB AFL Superkick and the WFNL AFL Nines Competition, along with the continued growth of the Under 7's competition.

We continued to bring NAB AFL Auskick and Superkick programs to schools across the whole school year with 29 School programs having Auskick delivered afterschool with 680 participants (499 male, 181 female) experiencing Auskick & Superkick in a safe and inclusive environment.

Our biggest Auskick & Superkick Centre at a school this year was 54 participants at Seabrook Primary School. We also ran a centre at Emma McLean Kindergarten with 65 participants in Term 3.

We ran 10 introductory NAB AFL Auskick and Superkick Programs in the community with 256 participants (164 male, 94 female) with our best performing centre being our Wyndham & Surrounds Term 1 community facing program with 49 participants. We were also able to run a Western Bulldogs AFLW All Girls Superkick program at Whitten Oval before all 5 Bulldogs home games with a total of 42 girls.

Across our NAB AFL Auskick Community Centres in the WFNL Region, we had a total 2488 participants with a new centre PEGS reaching 36 participants, while 13 of our Auskick Centres increasing in participation in 2025. Road to 3000 begins.

We continued our new mid-week sessions run by AFL Victoria; to help support some of our struggling centres and we will look to continue to introduce more in 2026 to provide alternate days and pathways for kids looking to play multiple sports.

Superkick was completed at 6 centres in 2025 in the West, although not the numbers we expected, we hope that with more time the product will continue to grow in 2026 and provide a brand-new pathway for kids to continue or join the game.

The Intro to Nines and At School Nines programs were introduced in Term 4, 2025, with Point Cook P-9 College and Emmanuel College proudly participating in the inaugural sessions.

Mount St Joseph Girls' College also launched a lunchtime Nines program, further broadening student access and engagement. These initiatives, alongside the At School Nines programs, are set to continue growing throughout 2026, fostering deeper involvement and development across a wider network of schools.

AFL Victoria continued School Holiday Programs in 2025 with Term 1, 2 and 3 School Holidays, working in partnership with our AFL Clubs the Western Bulldogs and North Melbourne. Across 15 Holiday programs we had 709 registrations including our biggest holiday program so far at Whitten Oval in Term 1 having 112 registrations.

The Under 7's Competition was back in 2025 with Auskickers experiencing a 4-week transition into Junior Footy. The program this year was a huge success with 466 Auskickers receiving their first taste of Junior Footy across two locations. A massive thank you to Truganina Thunder Football Club and Yarraville Seddon Football Club for hosting. We will aim to make the program even bigger next year.

The 2025 season was another year of meaningful commercial growth and strengthened relationships across the WFNL. With increased participation, rising engagement, and continued confidence in the WFNL brand, our commercial program expanded its reach and delivered value for partners and the broader community.

NEW PARTNERSHIPS

In 2025 welcomed several new organisations who added significant value to our season:

- Fernwood Fitness: Fernwood Fitness became the WFNL's official fitness partner, delivering multiple activations across the Senior Women's Grand Final and Netball Grand Finals, and providing exclusive offers throughout the season. Their commitment to supporting female participation aligned closely with league priorities.
- **Guzman y Gomez (GYG):** GYG partnered with the league with a clear focus on community impact. Every team received Player of the Match vouchers, and clubs benefited from discounted catering for team events. Their involvement supported players, coaches, umpires, parents and fans across all clubs.
- **Gilbert:** Gilbert joined as the exclusive netball supplier for the next two years, providing quality equipment that supports the rapid growth of our netball competitions.

- **SEDA College VIC:** SEDA College expanded their commitment by becoming naming rights partner for the U16 Boys and U16 Girls competitions. This upgrade reinforces shared goals around youth development and participation pathways.
- **Belgravia Apparel:** 2025 marked the first year of the Belgravia Apparel Netball Naming Rights partnership. With record growth in netball participation, this partnership is positioned for continued impact in future seasons.

In 2025 the WFNL continued to deliver engaging media content across all of its online platforms while continuing to add to our weekly output by delivering some new and exciting content.

After wrapping up the 2024 season and getting stuck into planning for 2025 the new year started with the annual WFNL Media Day which returned to Whitten Oval where we took advantage of the some recently renovated spaces which helped make the day an incredible success. Compared to previous years we had ample space to complete player photos and interviews which are featured heavily across our social media during the season.

This day is of course not possible without the efforts of Darrell and Kylie Jones of Local Legends – Team & Sport Photography. Alongside his matchday photography at football and netball, Media Day is one of the many of the events that Darrell is snapping. While acknowledging Local Legends for the great work they do, we must also thank the team of photographers that supported Darrell to capture this year's Junior Grand Finals which were all played on the same day across four different venues.





During the season the WFNL's content again included season previews, weekly football match reports and video highlights, image galleries, Junior Football Heartland Award recipients and a wide variety of social media graphics from ladders, fixtures and the leading performers from both the football field and netball court. Thanks to our partnership with Premier Data we were again able to highlight the standout players in the TIV Division 1 Senior Men's competition through the vast array of statistics they record.

Doing the bulk of the match reporting was again Connor Pain and Kel Rowe who covered the TIV Division 1 Senior Men's and St Vincent's Private Hospital Werribee Senior Women's competitions. Their contributions not only during the home and away competition, but also finals are greatly appreciated and give supporters of the league comprehensive match recaps each week.

Coinciding with the growth of the Belgravia Apparel Netball Competition was the level of coverage awarded to netball. More regular weekly content came via social media, in particular TikTok. WFNL Netball Coordinator Jordan Dalliston drove a lot of the content here with the platform popular amongst netballers. We were also fortunate to have photographer Tanaya Cunningham volunteer to help us capture more netball more regularly along with some of the feature rounds of the season.

Our Grand Final coverage was again standout with vision of Werribee Districts at the final siren and video of the thrilling overtime period in the TIV Division 1 Senior Men's decider among the most watched this year. There was some great Junior Grand Final content too, the best received was a goal after the final siren to win the Under 16 Girls Divisions 2 premiership.

WHAT WAS NEW IN 2025

This year we took steps towards delivering some new and exciting content. Most notable was WFNL TV – a monthly show highlighting some of the clubs and people within the league. We released our first episode mid-year and while we didn't produce as many episodes as we had hoped, we can't thank Sportscast Australia (Andrew, Matt and Brendan) enough for supporting us with this project. We were also fortunate to have the help of a local filmmaker Jagger Skilbeck who shot and cut the interviews and additional vision for all the feature segments.

We also produced several podcast episodes and the plan going forward is for this to be a permanent part of our media output each week in 2026. Our podcast episodes in 2025 included a mix of coach and player interviews while we also analysed football and netball results. The next steps with this is to lock in a format and any possible talent to host the podcast each week. Along with current or past players/coaches/ administrators we also hope to chat to some of the high-profile names previously associated with the league who have gone on to bigger things.



Each weekend in 2025 saw all Senior Football matches filmed by Sportscast Australia (15 games - 6x Division 1, 5x Division 2, 4x Senior Women). This provided us with more match vision and highlights helping us showcase the Division 2 Seniors and Senior Women's competitions like we never had before. It was not only great to be able to share footage with those who follow the League, but it also benefited coaches, players and clubs.

Along with additional match filming the WFNL Match of the Day was live streamed by Sportscast Australia every Saturday. Previously the Match of the Day had just been broadcast on radio (Wyn FM) but in 2025 our audience had the option of live streaming for a small fee or tuning in via the radio. The live stream featured the Wyn Fm radio commentary with the production also including score graphics and replays.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2026

As mentioned in the previous section, we intend to produce a weekly podcast and regular WFNL TV program in 2026 which is exciting for the League and the WFNL community.

Additionally, the WFNL website is currently being updated behind the scenes and once complete will offer a more modern and user-friendly look and feel. This refresh will include some new homepage features among other things, such as built-in fixtures and ladder which we haven't had access to since the move from GameDay to PlayHQ. This has been a big task for StackSports and is on track to go live in time for the commencement of the 2026 season.

Not that the following is anything new for 2026, but I want to acknowledge Wyn FM, the sensational Peter White and the WFNL commentary team of Andrew Wilson, Cade Lucas, Connor Pain and Nick Boylan who continue to produce one of the best local football broadcasts in all of community sport. It's a delight listening in every Saturday thanks to their intimate knowledge the the league and we can't wait to have the boys back calling the footy next year.

Thank you also to my colleagues in the WFNL office for your support, ideas and contributions to the media space in 2025. We look forward to bigger and better things in 2026.


